




What do Project Leaders need to know?

- Deliver bio-security project in conjunction with your animal science project meetings







- "Treatment" group members will receive bio-security proficiency pins
- Bragging rights tell your potential buyers that you used bio-security best practices in raising your animals
- Potential to reduce veterinary bills, raise healthier animals and get higher market prices
