 - A. COVID-19 Update and UC ANR 4-H Guidelines effective 1/25/2021, Tulare County remains in the PURPLE, WIDESPREAD, COVID-19 tier.
 - 1. 4-H meetings, programs, or workshops should be conducted remotely whenever possible; No indoor in-person meetings, programs, or workshops.
 - 2. The <u>Basic Safety Standards</u> and <u>Occupancy Limits</u> must be followed for all in-person events.
 - 3. Outdoor meetings, programs, or workshops are limited to a maximum of 10 people who maintain 6 feet of social distancing. Since 4-H Policy requires 2 ACTIVE adult volunteers at every meeting, events are limited to 8 youth and the 2 adult volunteers.
 - 4. In order for an ACTIVE 4-H Adult Volunteer to conduct an in-person meeting, program, or workshop, he/she must complete the <u>UC ANR COVID-19 Safety Training Survey for</u> <u>4-H Adult Volunteers Tulare County</u> and pass the quiz with 100%. *Decisions to allow 4-H in-person meetings are at the discretion of the UCCE County Director with direction from the County Public Health Officer. Any unauthorized in-person activities will not be covered by UC insurance and may not be included in 4-H record books. Corrective actions will be taken if 4-H volunteers or families host or participate in any unauthorized in- person 4-H activities.
 - a. Complete the <u>4-H Safety Protocol Checklist</u> at least 2 weeks prior to hosting the inperson meeting, event, or activity.
 - b. Display the <u>Procedures for 4-H Meetings during COVID-19</u> poster at all meetings and events (printed copies are available from the 4-H Office, if needed).
 - c. Post the <u>Symptom Survey</u> at the meeting so that everyone can see the questions AND have a greeter that will document attendance on the <u>Attendance Log</u>. If someone answers YES to one of the Symptom Survey questions, he/she may NOT stay at the meeting. The Attendance Log must be kept by the adult volunteer in charge of the meeting, event, or activity for 15 days, after which it must be destroyed.
 - 5. For ideas and tips on in-person meetings, refer to the <u>Planning Strategies for In-Person</u> <u>Meetings</u> and <u>Strategies to Reduce In-Person Meeting Size</u> documents. There is also an <u>In-Person Meeting Frequently Asked Questions</u> document.

 - <u>2020-2021 Beginning of Year Club Reporting Checklist</u> items were due 10/19/2020, but have not been received from: Elbow Creek, Exeter, Liberty, Oakdale, Pleasant View, Springville, Tule River, Wilson-Dinuba, and Hi 4-H.
 - 2. <u>Tulare County 4-H Enrollment Information</u>
 - a. If youth members enroll using paper forms pages 7-8 & 11-12 need to be turned into the 4-H office.
 - b. If adult volunteers enroll using paper forms pages 6 & 9-10 need to be turned into the 4-H office.
 - 3. Enrollment fees \$40 (\$38 cash/check discount) for youth and \$15 (\$14 discount) for adult; \$20/youth and \$6/ adult paid to state and \$18/youth and

- 4. County-wide (including all club and project level) events will need to follow current COVID-19 tier guidelines. Complete the <u>Virtual Event Proposal Plan</u> and submit it to the 4-H Office for review.
- <u>Returning Adult Volunteer</u> Re-enrollment Adults that were last active during 2019-2020 or 2018-2019 can re-enroll and take the 2020-2021 California Returning Volunteer Training through <u>eXtension</u> any time prior to 6/30/2021. The enrollment key is Tulare with a capital T.
- 6. (Livestock) Judging Day Show Smart online does not want to sell to the county, they want individual club, and the cost is only for the rest of this year. Livestockjudging.com has a free version that allows use of 43 classes and the Elite version is \$200 per year. Sarah Weber had her first Cross-County 4-H Livestock Judging project meeting on 2/13. She is planning virtual Livestock Judging events for Kings 4-H Fair and Kings Fair. Rochelle will check with her about including Tulare County and having it replace our own event or to use her event but score our kids separately and give our own awards. We will hold off on purchasing Show Smart or Livestockjudging.com for now.
- County Presentation Day Follow virtual format used last year and partnering with Fresno and Kings counties; Saturday, March 27th; 3 time slots 9 am – 2:45 pm; Evaluators needed; <u>University of California 4-H</u> <u>Presentation Manual</u> updated 1/28/2021. Please let Rochelle know if you have anyone from your club planning to participate by sending her an email.
- 8. Favorite Foods Day Adapt to a virtual format following the example from Riverside and Fresno counties. Rochelle will meet with Jody to revise the information to send out to clubs, project leaders, and youth.
- 9. County Fashion Revue Laura Schaper will chair the event which must take place prior to 4/24/21. The multi-county cluster had a meeting last week about partnering for a virtual event. Rochelle did not attend since she was out of town, but they are having another next week. She will work with that group and Laura to determine what to offer for Tulare county.
- 10. Dale Wimp is scheduled for Saturday, April 24, 2021. The Shooting Sports Committee is meeting on Thursday night, so more information should be available after that meeting.

 - <u>CDFA State Rules for California Fairs</u> ownership and enrollment guidelines: 120-day enrollment/supervision & ownership (or Horse Lease Agreement) was 1/11/21 for Market Beef, Horses, and Llamas & Alpacas, 60-day project enrollment/supervision 3/13/21 for all other project areas, 60-day ownership requirement 3/13/21 for market sheep, swine, veal and goats, and 30-day ownership requirement 4/12/21 for poultry, rabbits, and feeder and breeding animals.
