The enrollment key for the required eXtension training is Tulare with a capital T.
      - b. Returning Volunteers that had a lapse in service due to COVID-19, may

qualify for “[2021-2022 Volunteer Exemption](#)” which would allow them to re-apply as a 4-H Returning Volunteer without being re-fingerprinted or completing the new volunteer training. They are required to complete the [2021-2022 California Returning Volunteer Course](#) and the [Reporting Child Abuse and Neglect Course](#) prior to being made active for the current program year. Please contact the 4-H Office to see if you qualify for this “exemption”. The enrollment key for the required eXtension training is Tulare with a capital T.
