The CA 4-H Shooting Sports Events Webpage is housed on the original CA 4-H website, which is being replaced by the <u>CA 4-H Resource Center</u>. There is a link on the overall <u>4-H Calendar</u> to subscribe to the various project event calendars, including <u>Shooting Sports</u>. The old site contained the following information:

- a. CA 4-H Shooting Sports Training dates should be announced soon for this coming Spring on the 4-H Calendar mentioned above. In order to attend a training, the Training Request and Registration Form, 7/2019 must be completed and signed by County 4-H Staff and given to the instructor or registrar prior to training course. After completion of the course the participant must complete the CA 4-H Shooting Sports Program Application for Certification as a Shooting Sports Adult Volunteer, 7/2021 and turn it into the County 4-H Office for approval and submission to the State 4-H Office. Once processed by the state office the applicants name will be added to the approved leader list and the leader will receive notification of their approval. Approval must take place before the new leader can begin leading the project. The required forms for training are included on the Project Resource page for Shooting Sports of the CA 4-H Resource Center.
- b. State Shooting Sports Match Information for Rifle, Handgun, Skeet, and Trap was just receive this week and Rochelle passed it out to those present and will be posting it on our website. Entries and club payment (Club Checks ONLY made payable to Siskiyou County 4-H Council) are due to the Tulare County 4-H Office by March 8th. Rochelle is not sure where this information will be housed on the new CA 4-H Resource Center.
- c. Rochelle has not yet found the links to <u>Project Sheets</u> on the new CA 4-H Resource Center, but they are still available on the old site under Outdoor.
