Decorative Gourds, Natives, Perennials/Annuals, Roses, Succulents

DECORATIVE GOURDS

Autumn Wings	<i>Cucurbita pepo v. Ovifera</i>	<i>Crooked or straight, unique looking medium-sized, pear-shaped gourds in various colors and patterns; not recommended for culinary use.</i>
Crown of Thorns	<i>Cucurbita pepo</i>	<i>Crown-shaped, tri-colored fruits in gold, green, orange, white, and yellow. 4"-5" in diameter, great for decorative autumn arrangements.</i>
Small Gourds		<i>Hard-shelled, non-edible fruits suitable for decorative ornaments.</i>

NATIVES

Bee Balm	<i>Monarda</i>	<i>Perennial that attracts bees, butterflies, and hummingbirds. Vibrant flower heads are full of tubular petals.</i>
Black sage	<i>Salvia mellifera</i>	<i>Small, dark green, resinous leaves and numerous pale lavender flowers.</i>
California Bee Plant	<i>Scrophularia californica</i>	<i>Perennial with very small red to maroon flowers, extremely attractive to bees,</i>
California Fuchsia	<i>Epilobium canum</i>	<i>Native to CA foothills and coastal areas. Perennial with bright scarlet flowers.</i>
California Goldenrod	<i>Solidago velutina ssp. californica</i>	<i>Perennial herb in northern, southern and central CA. Birds and pollinating insects love it.</i>
Hummingbird Sage	<i>Salvia spathacea</i>	<i>Blooming sage favored by pollinators</i>
Purple Haze California Aster	<i>Aster chilense 'Purple Haze'</i>	<i>1" medium-lavender daisies open from dark purple buds; grows 1'-3' tall and spreads vigorously by rhizomes.</i>
Red-flowered Buckwheat	<i>Eriogonum grande var rubescens</i>	<i>Rosy-colored flower clusters and low-growing foliage. Flowers attract a variety of pollinators.</i>

PERENNIALS/ANNUALS (SOME EDIBLES)

Common Name	Botanical/Cultivar Name	Description
Cosmos	<i>C. bipinnatus</i>	<i>Native to Mexico. Low maintenance, late-blooming, showy annual.</i>
Cosmos, orange	<i>C. sulphureus</i>	<i>Compact annual with vibrant orange flowers</i>
Nasturtium	<i>Tropaeolum majus</i>	<i>Edible flowers have a peppery bite</i>
Nasturtium, Tip Top Alaska Salmon	<i>Tropaeolum minus</i>	<i>Compact plant, edible variegated leaves and salmon-colored flowers</i>
Nasturtium, trailing	<i>Tropaeolum majus</i>	<i>Larger blooms and leaves than bush varieties, but fewer flowers.</i>
Spanish Lavender 'Silver Anouk'	<i>Lavendula stoechas</i>	<i>Compact lavender with silver foliage and dark violet flowers. Disease resistant and durable.</i>
Spider Plant	<i>Chlorophytum comosum</i>	<i>Easy to grow houseplant; propagates itself.</i>
White Yarrow	<i>Achillea millefolium</i>	<i>Perennial wildflower producing abundance of huge, flat clusters of creamy white flowers.</i>

ROSES

American Beauty Climbing	<i>Cl. American Beauty</i>	<i>Old hybrid wichurana rose, deep pink, repeat blooming</i>
Autumn Damask	<i>Autumn Damask</i>	<i>Old Damask rose, pink, repeat bloom, very fragrant</i>
Crepuscule	<i>Crepuscule</i>	<i>Old climbing noisette rose, apricot, long blooming</i>
Dutcher	<i>Ducher</i>	<i>Old China rose, white rose, repeat blooming</i>
Gatewood	<i>Gatewood Street San Andreas</i>	<i>Old "found" rose, wichurana+multiflora, white, spreading form blooms profusely</i>
Glorie	<i>Glorie de Rosomanes</i>	<i>Old China rose, very hardy, red, repeat blooming</i>
Mutabilis	<i>R. Mutabilis</i>	<i>Old China rose, pink blend, long blooming</i>
Sanquinea	<i>R. Sanquinea</i>	<i>Old China rose, crimson, repeat blooming</i>

SUCCULENTS

Ghost Plant	<i>Graptopetalum paraguayense 'Peach'</i>	<i>Small, evergreen succulent with whitish-grey pointed leaves and trailing rosette form.</i>
Ghost Plant	<i>Graptopetalum paraguayense 'Pinky'</i>	<i>Small, evergreen succulent with whitish-grey pointed leaves and trailing rosette form.</i>
Tree aeonium	<i>Aeonium arboreum</i>	<i>Evergreen succulent with showy rosettes of shiny, fleshy, spoon-shaped, apple green leaves at the end of sausage-like branches</i>
