Plant an Herb or Veggie Garden

Are you looking for ideas for starting and maintaining an herb or vegetable garden? Well, the UCCE Master Gardeners of El Dorado County have a deal for you!

Perched in the Sherwood Demonstration Garden at the El Dorado Center of Folsom Lake College, 6699 Campus Drive in Placerville (off Green Valley Road) is an Herb and Vegetable Garden constructed by Master Gardeners to showcase growing options -- most notably in raised beds and containers.

Save the date! The Sherwood Demonstration Garden Grand Opening is October 3, 2015, where the public will be treated to 16 themed gardens, to include the Herb and Veggie garden. Many of the public education classes that are currently held in a classroom setting will be held at the Sherwood Demonstration Garden to give attendees a hands-on learning experience. Master Gardener classes cover various home gardening topics and gardening tips and tricks.

As a teaching venue, the herb and veggie garden will highlight planter box construction, best irrigation practices, timing for planting, and shade and support requirements.

With a focus on the current critical drought, watering schedules and techniques will be demonstrated to the public on how to optimize the amount and frequency of watering.

The Herb and Veggie garden has season-appropriate annuals now. As the Sherwood Demonstration Garden is opening in October, the Herb and Veggie garden will be planted in fall with annual veggies, to include onions, garlic, carrots, cabbage, radishes, lettuce and various herbs. Currently, there are summertime tomatoes, eggplant, and peppers that will be near the end of their growing season when the garden opens to the public. Crops produced by the garden will be harvested by the Master Gardeners and donated to local food banks.
