## Caring for your lavender cuttings

Follow these steps to take care of your cuttings:

- Moisten the soil well keep it moist like a rung-out sponge.
- Provide humidity by covering the cuttings with an upside-down plastic bag or plastic dome.
- Place the cuttings in a location with filtered sun, not a windowsill with full sun that can bake the cuttings.
- Open the bag periodically. If the soil is too moist, shake excess water out of the bag and leave it open. Water or mist if the soil feels dry.
- Root development should start in 4-6 weeks. You can give the cutting a slight tug to check for resistance.
- Plant in a one-gallon pot when you see substantial plant growth. Plant in your garden in the fall.
