These scholarships are open to graduating high school seniors in Tuolumne County who are 4-H members meeting the following criteria:

- Must be in at least their fourth year of 4-H membership at the time of application.
- Must show interest and involvement in activities at the club level and beyond: e.g. multi-club, county, area, and/or state 4-H activities.
- Plan to attend a specialized vocational school, community college, or four-year college or university.

Three \$1000 scholarships to be awarded, if deserving, to qualifying 4-H members. Youth may apply for one, two or all three scholarships on the same application. Limit of one scholarship awarded per member. Proof of college registration and at least a minimum record book must be received by 4-H Council before the actual award is paid.

1. 4-H Scholarship Application. Please give the following information on a separate sheet.

- Name, mailing address, email, phone
- 4-H Club, number of years as a 4-H member
- School now attending, year of graduation
- School you plan to attend. What influenced your choice?
- Future plans and goals including chosen vocation or field of study
- How did your interest in your chosen vocation develop?
- Give a brief summary of your 4-H involvement
- To be considered for the Ros Roberts scholarship: What life skills have you learned and how did you use them in the 4-H program? (A)
- To be considered for the Bonnie Scroggs scholarship: In the area of community service, what difference did you make in the lives of others? (B)
- To be considered for the Jeanne Thompson scholarship: Discuss your leadership role in the 4-H program. (C)
- What impact did these activities (A, B, C) have in your life?

2. High school transcript; does not need to be an official copy

3. Two letters of recommendation:

- One from a teacher or counselor
- One from the member's 4-H community club or project leader
- A recommendation may not be written by a person related to the applicant.
