The LA 4-H All Star Ambassadors MC'ed the program. Of course, we wish there had been more participation by members in the competition, but the numbers were about the same as last year, which is encouraging because we were still dealing with COVID-19 issues.

<u>2021 4-H Graduates</u> 2021 4-H Graduate pins and certificates were given out at district Achievement events in the fall. A 4-H graduate who was in 4-H for at least three years is eligible to receive an engraved 4-H graduate pin. Please contact Charlene Moore if one of your 2021 4-H graduates did not receive an engraved pin.

Record Book Manual for 2021-2022- The 2021-2022 manuals are on the county and state websites. Please read the Record Book manuals carefully and perhaps the districts should offer some leader and member training sessions. At this time, we expect that the County Record Book Competition will be run much like last year. Encourage your members to keep their records up-to-date during the year and not wait until summer to start their records.

<u>Junior/Teen Leader Merit Award -</u> Reminder - If a member wants to apply for a Junior or Teen Leader Merit Award, they need to be in Leadership project during the 4-H program year to be eligible for the award. All clubs should consider offering a Leadership project.

The forms and information for the 2022 Officer Book Recognition program are available on the county website. All club officers are encouraged to prepare their officer records for award consideration after the end of the program year. Officers should start working on this now. Officers are encouraged to make their office the best it can be and try for a Gold medal. The evaluation of the officer records is done with the Danish system of judging so all officers have a chance to earn a Gold medal for their officer work.

<u>2022-2023 LA County 4-H All Star Ambassador applications</u> are due by Friday, Feb. 18, 2022. The new LA County 4-H All Star Ambassadors will be announced on March 26. LA County 4-H All Star Ambassador is the highest county honor for a member. Experienced, accomplished senior members should be encouraged to apply for this working honor. It is an opportunity to expand their leadership skills and experiences.

The current county All Star Ambassador Team Advisor is moving out of town so a new adult Advisor will be needed for next year. If you are interested in being considered for this position, please contact Charlene Moore. Next year we expect to have two continuing All Star Ambassadors and hopefully a few new ones. Please encourage your experienced senior members to apply. The application and information is on the county website.

Friends of 4-H Each program year the County Council considers honoring an individual and/or organization that have been particularly helpful to the LA County 4-H program. Each district is encouraged to submit Friend of 4-H nominations to the County council at its next council meeting in March. Up to five such awards can be made for a year by the county council. The awards are presented at a special occasion arranged by the district nominating the recipient. Friend of 4-H nomination forms are available on the county website and should be submitted to the council President Peter Michel by March 26.

Reminder – The county is not planning a county-level Leader Appreciation event again this year. Districts are encouraged to plan their own Leader Appreciation event. If any of your leaders are due a special leader pin (for years 1, 5, 10, 15, etc.), contact the county office at least a month before you need the pins for your event.

<u>District Representation on the County I&R Committee</u> All districts should have two elected representatives on the county Incentives and Recognition Committee. The term for a representative is one year. The Entry by Video option will again be used for our virtual County Field Day. We hope to have the event packet for the virtual County Field Day activities out and on the county website by the end of next week. Although our county presentation activities will be done with YouTube videos, those who earn a Blue or Gold award and want to go on and compete at Regional (and then State) will need to compete "in-person" in a zoom room environment. Two exceptions to this are the areas of State Impromptu Speaking and the Interview Contest, which would need to be done "in-person" in a zoom room for County competition. County Impromptu Speaking and Extemporaneous Speaking will also be done "in-person" in a zoom room for County competition, but do not go on to the Regional competition.
