PURPOSE

- Acquaint landowners with water quality regulations and nonpoint source pollution.
- Help landowners review and document their resources, goals and management practices in a Letter of Intent and a Ranch Water Quality Management Plan.
- Provide assistance with the development of management plans.

OBJECTIVES

- Acquaint landowners with water quality regulations and assessments that can affect their farm & ranch operations.
- Complete a Letter of Intent for your ranch.
- Write a water quality plan for your ranch.
- Learn to monitor indicators of water quality.

TASKS

- Document current or existing practices that protect water quality.
- Learn what non point source pollution is and complete a non-point source self assessment of your ranch.
- Develop water quality protection goals based on your assessment.
- Select management practices that can be applied to improve water quality protection.
- Develop a field monitoring program that will allow you to document positive and negative changes that result from management and natural causes.

Three Levels of Planning

- Letter of Intent
- Nonpoint Source Plan
- Recognized Nonpoint Source Plan

Letter of Intent

- Evaluation of water quality status
- Existing & planned management practices
- Monitoring program

Ranch Nonpoint Source Plan

- Resource inventory
- Non-point source selfassessment
- Statement of goals
- Existing & planned management practices
- Monitoring program

Recognized Ranch Nonpoint Source Plan

- Resource inventory
- Non-point source self-assessment
- Statement of goals
- Existing & planned management practices
- Monitoring program
- Plan submitted to RWQCB for review/approval

Water Quality Issues Minimal

- No or minor water quality issues
- Letter of Intent recommended
- Filing with RCD or other local organization unnecessary but recommended

Water Quality Issues (State Assessment or 303d list)

- Nonpoint Source Plan recommended
- Recommend filing Letter of Intent with RWQCB designated organization

Water Quality Issues (TMDL or ESU)

- Nonpoint Source Plan recommended
- Letter of Intent filed with RWQCBdesignated organization
- Recommend filing Ranch Nonpoint Source Plan
