Shasta County 4-H Council Meeting Intermountain Council, McArthur, CA April 28, 2021

The April 28, 2021 meeting of the Intermountain 4-H Council was called to order by President Carol Dombroski at 7:03pm in George Ingram Hall. The flag salute and 4-H Pledge were led by Carol Dombroski. In attendance were Carol Dombroski, Erin Paradis, Katie Eastman, Sara Reynier, Heidi Greer, Suz Crane and Peggy Hebert.

Introductions were not necessary and there was no club sharing. There were no guests in attendance.

Minutes from the previous meeting were not available for review. Erin reported that she received several Thank You notes from kids in the Intermountain area for the Year Pins & Stripes.

Erin reported on the status of the 4-H bank accounts by providing a copy of the current check register, showing a final balance of \$40,878.14, with no outstanding bills.

The 4-H Representative Report consisted of Erin updating us on the county 4-H office having a new treasurer, and they are preparing for the Tehama District Fair. Council Scholarships have been awarded to 3 applicants (including Francie Ferguson of the Intermountain area). There have been no further updates to the COVID policies from the state 4-H office. Nate is developing some opportunities for a county-wide Outdoor Adventure Camp one-day project for members 12-16 years old. Information on that will be coming out in the TNT newsletter. Valley Field Day registration closes 4/30/21. There is still an opportunity for in-person YQCA Training in the Intermountain Area, possibly held in conjunction with Ag Stills Field Day. Dates were discussed, and will try to be scheduled for June 15, 16 or 17, 2021.

In Old Business, Heidi Greer of Burney 4-H reported that Fashion Revue went very well, as did Presentation Day, even with a few technical difficulties due to the virtual platform.

In New Business, we reviewed the event calendar for the remaining months of the 2020-21, and event dates for the 2021-22 program year. Please refer to Erin's notes regarding dates for the 2021-22 program year. There was discussion regarding scheduling Small Animal Field Day for this summer. Heidi will look at dates, possibly in June. It was confirmed that Poultry will be able to show at the Intermountain Fair this year. Jeff Earnest has offered to help facilitate Summer Field Day on July 24. There was discussion regarding plans the Valley area was making for combining 4-H Info Night, Achievement Night, and Family Kick-Off in September as a way to recruit members and showcase each club's projects. There were ideas about how to incorporate something similar in the Intermountain area.

The next meeting of the Intermountain 4-H Council will be at 7pm on 7/28/21 and will include Community Club Leader Training. A motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Suz Crane, seconded by Heidi Greer. Meeting was adjourned at 8:34pm.
