Re-opening of Sugarloaf Ridge State Park

- Sugarloaf was closed in December 2011 for the first time in its 48-year history due to the State of California's budget problems.
- Reopened in 2012 under management of Team Sugarloaf, a non-profit partnership of five groups, based mostly on volunteers.



First Year of Cal Nat- Sugarloaf Ridge State Park

- Program based entirely around our 4000 acre park.
- Strong showing and successful programming lead to on-going volunteer after the program at Sugarloaf.
- Many of the volunteers had commitments at other parks in the area.
- Volunteer coordinators attended program and expressed interest in expanding to other parks. Offered



Multiple Parks Threatened Closures in Sonoma Valley

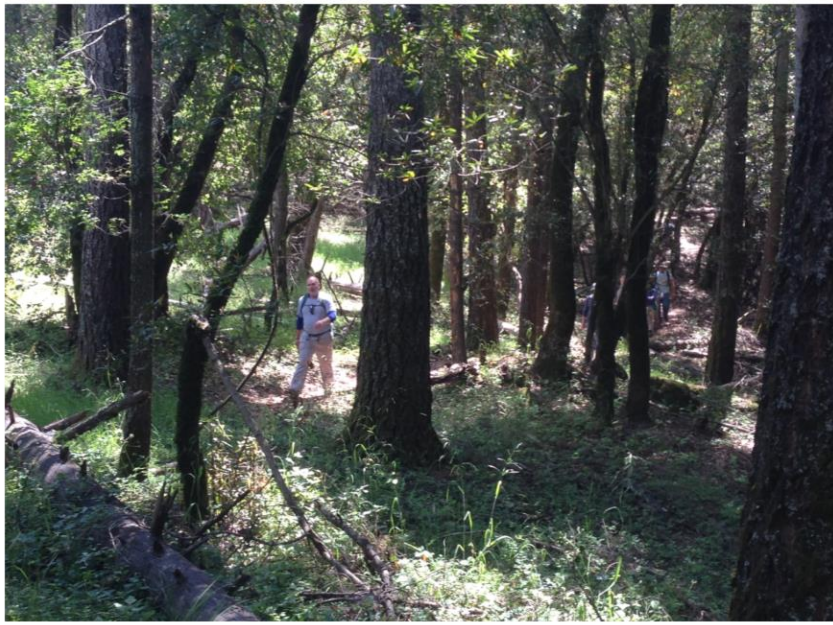
- In addition to Sugarloaf Ridge State Park, Trione-Annadel State Park and Jack London State Park faced fiscal constraints and threatened closures.
- All three parks now operate on partial or full non-profit management along with community and volunteer support.



New Program- Sonoma Valley California Naturalist

- Attended and co-led with volunteer coordinators of Jack London and Trione-Annadel Park
- Diversified fieldtrips to incorporate both parks and Open Space District Land.
- New experts and resources provided by partners
- Expanded outreach for enrollment to park partners list serve.
- Unified volunteer opportunities through shared quarterly newsletters.
