As the Founding Director of the Water Resources Institute at California State University, San Bernardino, I know the value of a water archive. We started a small archive ten years ago and turned it into a large regional water archive valued by the water industry, attorneys, researchers, land use planning agencies, historians, and other stakeholders. It contains two major collections and a number of smaller collections.

As a former member of the Advisory Board of the University of California Water Resources Center, and a visitor to the WRC Archives, I know the incredible value of its collections to those same stakeholders

As the General Manager of a State Water Contractor, I know how valuable it is to have historical resources available in your own backyard, particularly resources that can help in future litigation and in defining a historical context for current issues.

That is why I have prepared a resolution for approval of the San Gorgonio Pass Water Agency Board of Directors supporting the joint proposal from the University of California at Riverside and California State University, San Bernardino to house the Water Resources Center Archives. There are many potential users of these archives in Southern California, and in particular in the Inland Empire.

The addition of the WRC Archives would supplement and complement the WRI archives at Cal State, San Bernardino, which already have a full-time archivist. The resulting archive would be a colossus of research source material, historical information, maps, photos, and personal collections that would be readily available to millions of people and various stakeholders within a short driving




