All About Succulents, Noon

Succulents do well in our Mediterranean climate because their thick, fleshy leaves retain water during our long dry summers. The striking and unusual appearance of these plants makes them great choices for the garden and for containers. This workshop will focus on several types of succulents. The presenter will explain how to care for these plants in both hot and cold weather, and will describe various methods of propagation. Workshop participants will be given succulent leaves for home garden propagation.
