# Contra Costa County 4-H Stills Event 2023 Guidebook

Thank you so much for participating in the Contra Costa County 4-H Stills Event. This is an opportunity to show off the things you have made in your projects, demonstrate the skills you have learned, receive recognition and awards for the things that you have produced, and get feedback from evaluators that can help you improve your entries for the Contra Costa County Fair. Below is information for Stills Event submissions and evaluations.

### STILLS EVENT RULES OVERVIEW

4-H members submit entries to be exhibited and evaluated on the day of the Stills Event. Participants can submit only 1 entry per category below. Entries should be items that were produced within the past 4-H year (no earlier than 7/1/2022).

- Baked Goods
- Crafts
- Creative writing
- Drawing
- Legos: Freebuild/My Own Creation
- Legos: Set Build
- Mixed Media Art
- Needlecraft
- Painting
- Photography
- Quilting
- Raw Fleece
- Rocketry
- Record Keeping Projects
- Sewing (not wearable by the maker)
- Woodworking
- Yarn Arts

Each entry exhibit should include a written paragraph that describes in 60-100 words why the participant built, made or chose it. The paragraph should include what it is, how it is made (steps), meaning or significance of it and how it relates to one of your projects. Do NOT include your name or club. The paragraph is optional for primaries.

Do not put your name and club on your entry where it is visible to evaluators. You will be given a registration ID number and label to put on your entry on the day of the event.

Entries will be evaluated on 10 rubric criteria with a scoring from 1 to 4 where:

- 1 = Needs improvement
- 2 = Fair (approaching goal)
- 3 = Good (as it should be)
- 4 = Exceptional

There are no disqualifications, but omission of the descriptive paragraph and specific requirements will score 0 in that rubric criteria.

Junior, Intermediate, and Senior Members will receive scores and comments on the evaluation rubrics. Primary Members will not receive scores and will only receive comments.

Some categories may overlap with Fashion Revue and members have the option to register their item in either event, but not both events. State Fashion Revue may require items to place in

Scoring is on the Danish system and total scores will equate to the following awards: Gold 32+
Blue 28-31
Red 24-27
White Less than 23

Primary members will receive participation awards.

### **Baked Goods**

- Single items (cakes, pies, etc.)
- Batches (cookies, cupcakes, etc.) 4 or more should be submitted to demonstrate uniformity

Recipes must be included with the entry.

Evaluators will be sampling the baked goods, so please make sure that proper food safety and handling is practiced in preparing the submission. All entries need to be on a paper or plastic disposable plate and in a plastic bag or covered.

**Product appearance:** The overall visual appeal and presentation.

**Uniformity**: How consistent the quality of the product is from different viewpoints. For batches, how similar all samples are to each other.

**Shape:** How the shape appears consistent with the proper bake.

**Color:** How the color appears consistent with the proper bake (e.g. lightly browned)

**Volume or size:** How the volume or size is consistent with the proper bake.

**Flavor:** How it tastes.

**Texture:** How the texture appears and feels.

**Recipe:** How the recipe is presented. If the recipe is not included, 0 points will be awarded.

**Descriptive paragraph:** Describes in 60-100 words why the participant baked, made, or chose it. The paragraph should include what it is, how it is made (steps), meaning or significance of it and how it relates to one of your projects. The paragraph is optional for primary members. If a descriptive paragraph is not included for members (junior, intermediate or senior), 0 points will be awarded.

### **Crafts**

Crafts are something decorative made by hand, including jewelry, basketry, leather crafts, paper crafts, ceramics, hand-constructed dolls, toys an mixed media crafts.

**Appearance:** The overall visual appeal and presentation.

**General workmanship:** How the product is constructed with regards to quality, and the use and handling of the media and tools.

**Design:** Appropriateness of the final product for the design purpose or intended use.

**Materials use:** Materials are appropriate for the final product and demonstrate knowledge of techniques appropriate for that material.

**Neatness:** How clean the edges or ends of materials are tied or closed.

Balance of decoration and use: How well decoration and function of use are maintained.

**Sturdiness:** How durable and strong the item is for the intended use.

**Creativity:** The uniqueness and originality, how the participant shows imaginative use of materials and ideas.

**Descriptive paragraph:** Describes in 60-100 words why the participant built, made or chose it. The paragraph should include what it is, how it is made (steps), meaning or significance of it and how it relates to one of your projects. The paragraph is optional for primary members. If a descriptive paragraph is not included for members (junior, intermediate or senior), 0 points will be awarded.

## **Creative Writing**

Creative writing submissions should be directly related to a 4-H project and 2 pages or less. This can be a 4-H story, newsletter article, etc. Writing must be the original work of the entrant.

**Presentation:** The submission is written or typed neatly, clean and presented with a cover or in a binder or folder, or mounted on a poster board.

**Title:** The title captures the essence of work, is creative, and clear.

**Organization:** The work has a beginning, middle, end or an introduction, body, conclusion.

**Details**: The work includes characterization, dialogue, imagery, etc.

Non-fiction: who, what, where, why, when.

**Accomplishes purpose:** How well the work tells a story/entertains, informs, or persuades.

**Grammar:** Punctuation and capitalization are appropriate for age/grade.

**Spelling** is appropriate for age/grade.

**Overall appeal to reader/impact:** How the piece of writing appeals or impacts the reader **Descriptive paragraph:** Describes in 60-100 words why the participant built, made or chose it. The paragraph should include what it is, how it is made (steps), meaning or significance of it and how it relates to one of your projects. The paragraph is optional for primary members. If a descriptive paragraph is not included for members (junior, intermediate or senior), 0 points will be awarded.

## **Drawing**

Any original artwork (no copies of other artist's work, nor photographs) using pencil, pen, brush, charcoal, crayon, pastel or stylus produced by the participant. A single medium should be in this category. More than one medium used should be submitted in the mixed media art category. No weapons or knives may be on display. Maximum size of exhibit may not exceed 48"-by-48."

Contra Costa County Fair requires entries to be framed under glass and ready to hang with screw eyes and wire (no sawtooth hangers).

## **Legos: Freebuild/ My Own Creation**

Freebuild or My Own Creation is a product of the exhibitor's own design, not a LEGO® or Duplo® designed kit, a project found online, in a magazine, or from an app.

**Appearance:** The build is clean and presented in a neat manner.

**Originality:** The build is the participant's own design.

**Color:** The colors work together to complement the story or the purpose of the build.

Creativity of design: The build succeeds in telling a story, sets a scene, or represents a real-world object.

**Ingenuity in building:** Use of bricks in new or unusual ways. For example, using phone bricks to make a handrail or minifig binoculars to make horns on top of a truck.

**Joining and stacking appropriateness:** Bricks are joined and stacked together to provide strength. Even build, no space between bricks.

**Durability:** The build will hold together in normal conditions.

**Overall presentation:** The build is presented in a thoughtful manner.

**Descriptive paragraph:** Describes in 60-100 words why the participant built, made or chose it. The paragraph should include what it is, how it is made (steps), meaning or significance of it and how it relates to one of your projects. The paragraph is optional for primary members. If a descriptive paragraph is not included for members (junior, intermediate or senior), 0 points will be awarded.

**Appearance:** The build is clean and presented in a neat manner. **Completeness:** The set has all pieces and the build is finished.

**Complexity of construction:** The variety of techniques ranging from simple to complex.

**Followed instructions:** Finished product resembles design. **Durability:** The build will hold together in normal conditions.

Joining and stacking appropriateness: Bricks are joined and stacked together to provide

strength. Even build, no space between bricks.

**Accomplishes purpose:** The build achieves what is intended.

**Overall presentation:** The build is presented in a thoughtful manner.

**Descriptive paragraph:** Describes in 60-100 words why the participant built, made or chose it. ### **Mixed Media Art**

Any original artwork (no copies of other artist's work, nor photographs) using more than one medium to achieve the final effect produced by the participant. No weapons or knives may be on Display. Maximum size of exhibit may not exceed 48"-by-48."

Contra Costa County Fair requires entries to be framed under glass and ready to hang with screw eyes and wire (no sawtooth hangers).

Includes any needlecraft on wearable apparel or accessories, counted cross-stitch, counted needlepoint on either canvas or fabric, surface embroidery (e.g. as crewel, ribbon embroidery or needle-painting) of an individual's design or from a commercial kit.

**Appearance:** Clean, neat and ready to exhibit.

**Presentation:** Fabric is smooth and neat by pressing or blocking/securing on a backing.

**Design outline:** Outline is covered by stitches. Design centered on fabric.

**Stitching workmanship:** Stitches are formed accurately.

**Even tension:** No puckering, threads not pulled too tightly or too loose.

**Finishing:** Yarn or thread ends are woven into the back of work instead of being knotted. No loose or hanging threads. Any seams should not attract attention unless it is a design feature.

**Ready for use:** Can be used for its intended purpose.

**Suitable materials:** Thread suitable for fabric and design. Fabric suitable for intended purpose. **Descriptive paragraph:** Describes in 60-100 words why the participant built, made or chose it. The paragraph should include what it is, how it is made (steps), meaning or significance of it and how it relates to one of your projects. The paragraph is optional for primary members. If a descriptive paragraph is not included for members (junior, intermediate or senior), 0 points will be awarded.

## **Painting**

Any original artwork (no copies of other artist's work, nor photographs) using a single paint medium. More than one medium used should be submitted in the mixed media art category. No weapons or knives may be on display. Maximum size of exhibit may not exceed 48"-by-48."

Contra Costa County Fair requires oil/acrylic/pastels on canvas, masonite or paper entries to be framed and ready to hang with screw eyes and wire (no sawtooth hangers). Watercolor, gouache or egg tempera paint on paper are required to be framed under glass and ready to hang with screw eyes and wire (no sawtooth hangers).

## **Photography**

Contra Costa County Fair Rules: All photographs must be no smaller than 8"-by-10" and no larger than 16"-by-20." Prints must be dry or spray mounted onto an 11"-by-14" or 16"-by-20" backing board. Use foam core, photographic mounting board or 4-ply mat board for your backing board. You may wish to use a window mat.

**Composition:** The photo has a clear subject. How the positioning, framing, and elements are arranged in the photo.

**Contrast/Color:** How color, light-to-dark contrast is used in the photo.

**Perspective:** How distance, position, or angle of the camera affects the image.

**Lighting:** How external lighting is used on the subject and elements in the photo.

**Focus:** How well the subject(s) are in focus and sharp.

**Presentation:** How well the photo was matted/mounted (color chosen complements photo). Mounting should follow the county fair rules in order to score a 4. If the photo is not mounted, the score will be a 0.

**Overall creativity:** The use of the imagination or original ideas.

**Total effect:** The artistic elements of the image work together to communicate an idea, image, thought, story, or emotion.

**Descriptive paragraph:** Describes in 60-100 words why the participant built, made or choose it. The paragraph should include what it is, how it is made (steps), meaning or significance of it and how it relates to one of your projects. The paragraph is optional for primary members. If a descriptive paragraph is not included for members (junior, intermediate or senior), 0 points will be awarded

### **Quilting**

**Overall appearance:** The general attractiveness or appeal of the item.

**Quilting design pattern:** The pattern has unity, rhythm, balance and is proportional to the quilt size.

**Quilting design color:** The colors are compatible and effectively contrast to enhance the overall design.

**Materials use:** How fabric and materials used are appropriate for the final product and demonstrates knowledge of techniques appropriate for that material.

**Construction piecing:** How well pieces are put together and execution of seams.

**Borders and binding:** How well the border is executed and complements the overall design, how well the batting fills the binding.

**Backing:** How well the backing is executed and complements the overall design.

**Stitches:** Quality of stitching (even in length, tension, spacing)

**Descriptive paragraph:** Describes in 60-100 words why the participant built, made or chose it. The paragraph should include what it is, how it is made (steps), meaning or significance of it and how it relates to one of your projects. The paragraph is optional for primary members. If a descriptive paragraph is not included for members (junior, intermediate or senior), 0 points will be awarded.

### **Raw Fleece**

**Handle:** The actual feel of wool. Handle should be characteristic of breed.

**Cleanliness:** The fleece is as free from adhering sand, dirt, contaminants and vegetable matter (burrs, stickers, chaff, and seed heads) as much as possible.

**Lack of second cuts:** There should be no small pieces of short fleece remaining in the fiber caused by shearing the same area twice.

**Staple length uniformity:** A staple is a single lock of fiber. Staple length is the average length of fiber in a fleece measured from the to the tips of the unstretched individual fibers. Look for uniformity of length throughout the fleece. Fleeces should meet minimum staple length. Participants should be familiar with acceptable staple lengths for each grade of wool. (For example, 2 ¾ inches is considered full staple for fine wool; minimum acceptable length is longer for coarser wools.)

**Purity:** Purity refers to freedom from black or pigmented fibers, hair and kemp.

**Lock/staple soundness:** A lock is a small, approximately finger-sized bit of wool that tends to stay together when shorn from the sheep. Sound fibers are able to resist breaking either during processing or by pulling with the hands.

**Lock style/crimp uniformity:** The lock style/crimp should be even and well-defined. Crimp is the natural waviness of the wool fiber; it varies with the diameter of the fiber. Style relates to the wave and/or twist found in suri fleece. This wave or twist is an indication that the fleece is not of a straight hair type.

**Micron uniformity, Luster/brightness:** The sheen, gloss or shine of the fleece and fiber, due to the reflection of light off the smooth scales of each fiber. Luster/brightness should be characteristic of breed.

**Descriptive paragraph:** Describes in 60-100 words why the participant built, made or choose it. The paragraph should include what it is, how it is made (steps), meaning or significance of it and how it relates to one of your projects. The paragraph is optional for primary members. If a descriptive paragraph is not included for members (junior, intermediate or senior), 0 points will be awarded

## **Record Keeping Projects**

**Visuals:** How pictures and captions are used to describe ideas or stories

The paragraph should include what it is, how it is made (steps), meaning or significance of it and how it relates to one of your projects. The paragraph is optional for primary members. **Glue lines and fillets:** All glue lines should be smooth, clean and continuous. There should be a smooth transition from one surface to the other

Fin assemblies: Fins are even, balanced, straight and secure

**Parachute assembly:** Parachute is secured appropriately, the parachute is the proper type of parachute for the rocket, it is clean and neatly stowed.

**Overall Neatness:** Rocket displays neat and clean construction and design application **Paint application, Color choices, Decals:** Paint is even with smooth lines, decals are flat without bubbles, display is pleasing in design.

**Finish, free of dents and nicks, etc.:** Rocket is constructed correctly without dents and nicks **Creativity:** Design is thoughtful, demonstrating creative components and uniqueness without compromising purpose or intent.

**Flightworthiness, balance, mass, structure:** Construction is correct and rocket is flight worthy. Rocket is balanced and mass is appropriate for design (not obviously nose heavy, etc.)

**Descriptive paragraph:** Describes in 60-100 words why the participant built, made or choose it. **Appearance:** The item is neat and clean.

Color: Color is coordinated.

**Appropriate accessories/decorations** such as buttons are second in interest and proper size for the item.

**Uniform tension and gauge**: Tension is how tightly the yarn is pulled. Gauge typically suggested by a pattern. Gauge is the measurement of a specific number of stitches per row and rows per inch. If your tension is looser than the gauge swatch there are *fewer* stitches per row. If your tension is tighter than the gauge swatch there are *more* stitches per row.

**Stitches** are uniform and not twisted, split or dropped. (Macrame: Knots ties correctly, properly spaced.) New colors and threads added inconspicuously

**Finishing:** ends are finished securely, ends inconspicuous yarn size (as in the width of a particular yarn) is actually called yarn weight and refers to the thinness or bulkiness of a yarn.

Yarn & needle/hook suitable for item: The hook size(s) suggested in the pattern. Yarn selection appropriate for the project.

**Overall presentation:** The final product is set and shaped.
