New Business

Adopt-A-Family- Abby made a motion for Council to adopted six youth and four adults for adopt-a-family. This was seconded by Corie Hurlburt and unanimously approved by attendees.

Increase Awards and Recognition Budget- Previously purchased was about six years' worth of awards which threw off the budget. Corie made a motion to increase the awards and recognition budget to \$4,000 and Abby Alves seconded. Unanimously approved by attendees.

Committee/Project Reports

Fair Cookhouse Renovations Committee Update – Committee Chair, Marci Sanchez reports she had a meeting with Kathy Bartel about the roof and counter. There is some concern about the electrical and getting it to the cookhouse but will keep us updated. Marci states the Fire Marshall may call for a hood in the roof of the BBQ area. Kathy to check with Fire Marshall.

Star Awards and Leaders' Appreciation Event Recap – Christine Kampmann, UCCE Office and Lake 4-H Community Club – Committee Chair, Lisa Humphreys; Christine Kampmann reports great attendance. Significantly larger attendance this year vs. last. The four youth that did the MC'ing did a great job. Lisa Humphreys reported it was her first time attending this event and it was a great event. Liked how the youth presented the awards. Kids liked the smores; Things to consider for next year: got dark early, hard to hear for some especially with the traffic, a lot more awards given out this year.

Bowl-A-Thon Committee Update – Committee Chair, Willows 4-H and Plaza 4-H Community Club, Corie Hurlburt and Abby Alves reports everything is done. All clubs should have received bowl-a-thon packets. Just working on a few donations left. Asked if there was any feedback from clubs regarding door prizes. Stoney Creek states they will be donation a basket. Currently there are 32 participants registered. Kids are excited about the ugly sweater theme.

Livestock Challenge/Field Day Event Committee Update – Committee Chair, Capay 4-H and Lake 4-H Community Club. Amanda Lefor reports all animals are secured. If anyone wants to volunteer for judging (reasoning) please arrive by 9:30 am to get set-up. They are wanting about 20 adult volunteers. Shawna Jones reports two planning meeting coming up. One this Thursday; The challenge will be from 10am – 2pm. The judging will be from 9am-12pm.

Emerald Star Presentation-Emerald Star Applicant, Adrianna Hurlburt shared the community service project she would like to complete. Meeting attendees asked a few questions. Adrianna will be making hygiene bundles for the homeless from community donations. She plans to have the bundles done before Christmas. Adrianna states she will ask other clubs to donate items and if they do, to please have items to the office or her by 12/11/22. Council dismissed Adrianna and Corie Hurlburt so they could discuss approval or denial of application. Emerald Star application unanimously approved by Council.

Staff Reports-Christine Kampmann

- Glenn County 4-H Fair Exhibition Requirements 2022-2023-Call office if you have any questions.
- Glenn County 4-H Program Participation Guidelines-Presentation topic must be on what is being exhibited at the fair. Debbie Scritchfield asked “what if a youth member gives a presentation on cooking but then doesn’t exhibit anything re: cooking. But also has an animal?” Council did not have an answer to that question at this time.
- Enrollment Update- 305 youth approved and of those 227 jr, intermediate, senior members and 78 primary members. There is a total of 368 youth signed up but some awaiting review.
- CSU 4-H Livestock Evaluation 101/201/301 Series- 201 series was just held. There were over 50 attendees- a few from Glenn County. There was a suggestion to push back the livestock evaluation series by a month due to it occurring so soon into the 4-H year. Printed manuals can be found in key leader boxes.
- Presentation Day 101 Training-11/3/22 @ 6:30pm-7:30pm. Will review presentation topics, give examples. 201 will be at a later date and will be for members to practice and receive feedback regarding their presentation.
- Extension Courses-Can come into the office and use the computers to finish enrollment.

- Spark Achievement Program-both pathways (new & previous achievements) will be available this year. This year is a soft launch for the new achievement program. Continue to support the youth on the path they are on per Christine. New webinar dates added for the new spark achievement program-Reach out to office for those dates and times if interested.
- 4-H State Policy Reminders-Project leaders may not hold meetings prior to being approved. Remember to always have two leaders present.
