- Secretary elected at first meeting

Duties:


- share knowledge about upcoming animal science 4-H activities

When/Where:


- Determined prior to first meeting

When/Where:


- Determined prior to first meeting

- chair elected at first meeting
- chair required to represent committee at representatives meeting

When/Where:

- May meet in person or virtually, however in person is encouraged
- at least one meeting each month, but may have more as needed

- create incentives program to increase sense of belonging in 4-H and increase participation in events
- help manage and run awards at the Achievement Awards event
- researching and sharing awards, scholarships, etc. available to 4-H members and volunteers

- organize volunteer networking opportunities and workshops for volunteers (with office)
