TEACHING NEW HOME GARDENERS

- In 2021, 136 people virtually attended monthly "Garden Talks" on topics like drought-tolerant gardening, vertebrate pest control, creating healthy soil, and composting.
- Our popular four-class series, "Victory Vegetable Gardening for True Beginners", went online and taught 63 graduates how to grow food at home (260 total contacts).

BUILDING STRONG PARTNERSHIPS

The Santa Barbara Botanic Garden welcomes UC Master Gardeners back for native plant and drought-resistant gardening advice and Invasive Shot Hole Borer information tables. Mesa Harmony Garden, a non-profit food forest which provides fresh produce to food banks, resumes in-person educational programming in 2022 with UC Master Gardener support.
