

The Top Ten Ways to Conserve Water in Your Landscape and Garden in San Bernardino County



- 1. Select water-efficient plants that grow well in your climate: Sunset Zones 18/19 for Inland Valley cities; Sunset Zone 11 for Yucca Valley, Hesperia, 29 Palms, and Barstow areas; Sunset Zone 3A for mountains.
- 2. 'Hydrozone': Place plants with similar water needs together and drip irrigate all non-turf/groundcover areas. Water to the depth of:
 - 6"-8" for annuals, perennials, and turf
 - 8"-12" for shrubs and perennials
 - 1-1/2' 2' and deeper for trees
- 3. Water established plants deeply and let roots dry out some between watering.
- 4. Water your grass based on minutes listed in the 'Lawn Watering Guide': http://ucanr.org/freepubs/docs/8044.pdf
- 5. Mix soil amendments (compost, etc.) into sandy and clay soil (add at least 40% by volume and mix evenly to 8" or deeper).
- 6. Spread mulch around garden plants and trees (wood chips, rock, etc.).
- 7. Water early in the morning.
- 8. Control weeds.
- 9. Avoid over-fertilizing.
- 10. Sweep walkways and driveways rather than hose them down.
