Develop a plan –

What are you going to do to make a difference? A multi step or point action plan is always more successful.

Example- public speaking steps

- Members lead flag salute & 4H pledge. Pair up mini or new members with older members
- Team Demonstrations
- Co- Project or committee reports at club meeting
- Grab Bag Demo- limit to 2 minutes, simple topics
- Give a simple report at a project meeting
- Give a Project or committee report at a club meeting
- Attend County Presentation day (just to watch)
- Give a Demo at a club meeting
- Participate at County Presentation Day or other 4H event

Tips to Make Planning easy

- 1. Make sure you have enough time to complete your club plan. This should be your longest meeting of the year. Be sure to plan breaks and have snacks.
- 2. Invite all club parents, leaders and members to attend the meeting. The more input you get the better the plan.
- 3. Have the upcoming County Calendar available. Incorporate it into your plan.
- 4. Have last year's plan for reference.
- 5. Bring everyone into the planning. Give them an opportunity to share ideas. Make them participate by giving a new idea in each category.

- 6. Use Poster Board or large memo sheets, one for each area or category. Seeing things in large print helps members stay on track and remember what they discussed.
- 7. Have supplies available. Post-it notes, pens, markers, etc..
- 8. Keep everyone on track by covering one area or category at a time.
- 9. Break into teams to plan each area or problem solve growth areas.
- 10. Have members vote on final category plan.
- 11. Develop club budget only after the plan is complete
- 12. Combine activities when possible. A team building activity can be also be a community service and club event as well as an opportunity to win an award. (Example- Hold a "Get 2 Know you" beach cleanup with lunch afterwards and playing in the surf. Add a sand castle contest or trash collection contest and you got all three.
