Benefits Youth Gain from Showing Livestock

Raising livestock projects involve lots of early mornings, late nights, and long hours to accomplish the care these animals require. Working with livestock teaches youth several life skills and valuable lessons that will set them up for success in the future.

- **Responsibility**. Animals rely on a caretaker to provide them with the proper nutrition and daily care. Caring for show animals teaches the importance of consistency and attention to detail. Youth provide their livestock with the exact amount of feed, exercise, and grooming to ensure they are looking their best.
- **Personal Values.** Growing up around livestock helps youth to build a solid foundation of values. Through long hours, youth learn the value of hard work, how to achieve goals, patience, compassion, and respect.
- Competition & Sportsmanship. Healthy competition teaches resilience and perseverance which prepares youth for real-life situations. Exhibiting livestock teaches kids the importance of showmanship, learning at an early age how to win and lose gracefully.
- **Financial Sense.** It's no secret, showing livestock is an expensive hobby. Youth raising livestock learn about investments, record keeping, and how to finance their project.
