INCENTIVES AND RECOGNITION COMMITTEE

An **incentive** is a stimulus that creates a desire in an individual to participate, learn, or achieve. An incentive to participate in an activity exists prior to the activity itself, for example, the expectation of personal satisfaction or the expectation of a reward.

Recognition is the acknowledgment and affirmation of an individual for completing a task or achieving a result. This recognition can include a plaque, a hat pin, a certificate, a small gift, a letter or a public Thank You.

A **reward** is a positive reinforcement that follows the completion of an activity or the achievement of a goal.

Through a review of the past and current opportunities, the Monterey County Incentives and Recognition Committee approved new recognitions to our County program in 2020. These were introduced and are available again this year. Please share widely in your club!

Star Presenter - Is given to a 4-H member who has presented their 4-H Presentation five or more times during the program year. The criteria is set and an application form must be completed. This includes a certificate and a medal for a 4-H hat.

Rising Star Award - To recognize first year 4-H members who participate in a set number of activities at both club and county level. 4-H members may receive this award only one time. Applicants ages 9 and up. The 4-H member must meet the requirements of and turn in a Rising Star Application form. Rising Star recipients will receive a recognition pin for a hat.

County Chairman recognition - Given to a 4-H member who was a youth chairman of a club's Council Committee. . The criteria are set and an application form must be completed. This includes a certificate and a medal for a 4-H hat.

Friend(s) of 4-H – Plaque sponsored by the Monterey County 4-H Leaders Council. Presented to an individual, organization, group or business as a token of appreciation from the 4-H Program for help and support of the Monterey County 4-H Program. Nominations from the 4-H community.
