- Gonzales spoke about livestock being attacked, two were killed and one injured. Filing

 Gonzales PD, Granite Construction, Cypress Coast Fence to replace lambs + build back

Committee Reports

a. FFD overall – KCBR

- a. Chair Marlene, 4 rotations, started at 9 am, budget \$1,000, \$734.96 spent, 106 pre-registered, 83 showed up, total 110 members, no number of volunteers or attendance, sign up sheets assigned to colored groups but all walk ins were not categorized, need one sign up for volunteers, only 2 clubs sent money for lunch (all others paid at the door), Orradre building was great usage, lots of standing time
- b. FFD poster contest KDBR
 - a. Marlene (Healthy Living): 5 adults signed up to judge, good turn out
- c. FFD community service Aromas
 - a. Vday card making, acorn planting, overestimated the interest in both; recipients were Meals on Wheels, Casa of Monterey County, Wonderwood Ranch. Exec board feedback was great with two tactile sessions to balance out timing
- d. FFD Livestock judging Chualar
 - a. No issues, not a ton of high medals available to achieve, may need to get skills workshop included; possibly switch to skill builder instead of contest
- e. FFD Veggie ID Mission
 - a. Just information and not a judging aspect, learning about weeds / seeds, then got to apply the work, will re-work worksheets, 10 club members + 10 parents
- f. FFD Baking contest Royal Oaks
 - a. 32 pre-registered with 25 showed, 3 -senior, 11 Int, 10 JR, 1 clover; awarded top 3, youth got to judge a people's choice, some commented the flyer was not distributed well enough, whole club was present
- g. FFD tabulations Spring
 - a. 5 volunteers (3 too many), certificates already printed, don't need to be there at 8am, youth names were misspelled so adults need to help sign in
 - Exec board voted/suggested to have Poster Contest + Tabulations together for next year
- h. Presentation Night Gonzales
 - a. Sanitago Cuevas March 18 virtually, 1 hr time slots from 9-4pm, finalizing judges, encourage members to sign up asap, allowed SLO county 10 slots to be included, link will go out a few days before event; 50/50 decision with virtual vs in person, Gonzales wanted more club participation in the event
- i. Presentation Night Tabulations Lockwood
 - a. Registration procures how many judges we need
- j. CMG Natividad
 - Lauren Sparks hosted on Sun April 2 at Toro, all 4-H members are free, adults / public is \$30 due by March 10, [t-shirt + medal + color packs], other prizes with different categories, BBQ after, clubs can sponsor t-shirt space
- k. Interview Contest Carmel Valley
 - a. Stefano Goldman at SSB Construction, 5 pm, poster + flyer completed, jobs posted, online registration open, working on filling judges, organizing certificates
 - b. Date correction for Interview Contest to March 31, not April

Fair Reports

- SVF online entries are open, still entries need at least one entry for every livestock entry under 4-H or FFA project enrolled in, can still enter in an open division, due by April 1, not expecting a poultry show
- Push the Lauren Burns award \$500 to club with most entries entered / fair participation

Club Sharing

- Direct asks, adult advisors, check in via email + meetings + texts, when youth sign up for committee their parents are committed, parent meetings, staff presentations about rolls
- If there are no appointed council members, VMO is the alternative to run our program vs Council; changes board requirements which then makes funds revert back to the state

- Presentation event Lorin will send a list as registrants enter, confirm category and alter if needed
 - Star Presenter award is also up for grab
- Sectional Presentation Day regional is live, Lorin has number of attendees
- FFD results were handed out so do something great for those involved
- Family Survey will be distributed to fill out
- Volunteers burn out, big topic at the State level as well, county council is the only area we can control what happens, Lorin will be offering more training / workshops with adults (could be virtual)

- Scholarships need to be available by email, need to be in by May, have something in the budget
