## 4-H EMERALD STAR

### WHAT IS AN EMERALD STAR?

An Emerald Star is a 4-H member who wishes to share his/her skills and knowledge in any area of 4-H to help others. This is a working honor, and members receiving this honor must complete their plan within a year from the time they are selected. They will receive their Emerald Star Pin when their plan is completed.

#### WHAT IS AN EMERALD STAR PLAN?

It is a project which the member selects to plan and accomplish to help others on a county level, or in their community. The project or plan does not have to be a new idea. It can be planning a Dog or Horse Show, Field or Training Day for a project area, or doing a community service project to help others.

## WHAT ARE THE REQUIREMENTS? Timeline: April through March following year

- 1. Any 4-H member who has achieved the Bronze Star, is in the 7<sup>th</sup> grade or above but has not previously held Emerald Star.
- 2. Prepare and present a plan to provide some type of leadership on a county level, or in the community.
- 3. The plan must reflect that you assume all financial costs: such as printing and distributing materials, etc. Should you need funding to complete the project you should identify where you are going to obtain the funding.
- 4. Submit one copy of the completed plan to the 4-H Office by the APRIL application deadline. (Any revisions must be completed and presented at the beginning Emerald Star interview).
- 5. Attend an interview discussion (Early MAY)
- 6. Present project to at least 2 clubs for feedback/evaluation during the project year.
- 7. At the end of the project year, provide a written self-evaluation with support materials (mid-APRIL) of work completed.
- 8. Attend a completion interview (APRIL), and present at the APRIL Leaders Council Meeting.

#### HOW ARE 4-H EMERALD STARS SELECTED?

4-H members submitting plans are interviewed by a panel of three judges. The plan they submit is reviewed to make sure that it has the following:

- $\pm$  It is of value to the Madera County 4-H Program, members and/or leaders.
- $\pm$  It is of value to the community and to others.
- $\pm$  The plan is realistic, practical and can be accomplished.
- $\pm$  The plan shows thought and is in keeping with what 4-H stands for.
