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Why Do We Have to Register in Every County



- **California Food & Agricultural Code 11732**
 - *It is unlawful for any person to advertise, solicit, or operate as a pest control business in any county unless the person has registered with the commissioner for the current calendar year.”*
- **California Food & Agricultural Code 12031**
 - *“Each agricultural pest control adviser who makes any recommendation for agricultural use shall register in person with the agricultural commissioner in the county listed in the adviser’s address on the license issued pursuant to Article 2 (commencing with Section 12021) or with the director if the county does not have an agricultural commissioner.”*
- **California Food & Agricultural Code 11920**
 - *“It is unlawful for any person to act as a pest control aircraft pilot in any county without first registering with the appropriate county agricultural commissioner.”*
- **California Food & Agricultural Code 15204.5**
 - *(a) It is unlawful for any licensed Branch 1 Structural Pest Controller licensee, including structural pest control operators, field representatives, applicators, and Structural Pest Control Board (SPCB) registered companies, as defined in Section 8506.1 of the Business and Professions Code.....*

Mariposa County Ordinance No. 808



- *all persons engaged in any pest control services for hire in Mariposa County are subject to annual registration fees.....*

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Operator IDs and Restricted Materials Permits



- **3CCR 6622 Operator ID's**
 - (b) This subsection applies to the production of an agricultural commodity. Prior to the purchase and use of pesticide(s) for the production of an agricultural commodity, the operator of the property (or the operator's authorized representative) shall obtain an operator identification number from the commissioner of each county where pest control work will be performed. The operator shall provide each pest control business applying pesticides to such property with his or her operator identification number.
 - (c) This subsection applies to the pesticides listed below, when they are not used for the production of an agricultural commodity (e.g., uses on cemeteries, golf courses, parks, right-of-way, post-harvest agricultural commodities, and certain nonagricultural sites). Prior to the purchase and use of pesticides listed below, each operator of the property (or the operator's authorized representative), shall obtain an operator identification number from the commissioner of each county in which the operator intends to perform pest control. The operator of the property is not required to obtain an operator identification number when a person performing pest control for hire purchases and applies these pesticides.
- **Operator ID's and Restricted Material Permits for Mariposa County should expire on 12/31/2019**
- **Operator ID's using a federal restricted materials**
 - QAC or PAC must be current before renewal
- **Restricted Material Permits**
 - QAC and PAC must be current before renewal

History



- 1990 implementation the full use reporting program, using authority for the pesticide residue monitoring program
- An OIN is an “identification” number issued to property operators and entered on their pesticide use report. *The OIN is issued specifically for management of pesticide use data to identify a unique entity.*
- The CAC issues an OIN to the operator of the property (or the operator’s authorized representative) in order to purchase and use pesticides for a specified period

OINs are required prior to the purchase and use of pesticides for



- Production of an “agricultural commodity” (*3CCR section 6000*)
- Non-production agricultural use and certain non-agricultural uses where:
 - Agricultural pesticides are used (see exceptions)
 - Any pesticide in 3CCR section 6400 (including federal restricted use pesticides)
 - Industrial post-harvest commodity treatment
 - Groundwater pesticides for industrial or institutional use



- Title 3 of the California Code of Regulations (3 CCR) sections 6622 – 6628 addresses pesticide use record keeping, operator identification numbers, site identification numbers, and reporting requirements for property operators and pest control businesses.

DPR annual PUR report



- DPR collects the submitted PUR data from the CACs and generates an annual report including statewide and county summary reports by chemical (active ingredient) and commodity, top five chemical and commodity reports, a top 100 chemical report, and a trends analysis of certain chemical and commodity categories.

How the PUR data is used



- The PUR data is used by many groups such as governmental agencies, educational institutions, environmental groups, public interest organizations, and research companies. The data is used to make decisions affecting human health, ground and surface water, air, and the environment, including:
- Estimating dietary risk
- Ensuring compliance with clean air laws and ground water regulations
- Analyzing how, when, and where pesticides are used on crops when considering reduced-risk pest management alternatives
- Determining potential endangered species habitat issues using geographic data
- Calculating the amount of VOC emissions in nonattainment areas
- Evaluating possible human illness clusters



- Pesticide applications for which pesticide use records and pesticide use reports must be made include:
- Most “agricultural use” pesticide applications:
 - All pesticides used in the production of an “agricultural commodity” (3CCR section 6000)
 - Non-production agriculture pesticide treatments in poultry and fish production, as well as some livestock applications
 - All pesticides used in non-production agricultural use settings (such as cemeteries, golf courses, parks, ditch banks, and rights-of-way)
- Post-harvest pesticide treatments of agricultural commodities (whether on-farm or industrial use)
- Any restricted material as listed in *3 CCR section 6400* (including all federally restricted use pesticides).
- All pesticide applications by pest control businesses (agricultural or structural)
- Pesticides listed in the Groundwater Protection List (*3 CCR section 6800(b)*) for any outdoor institutional or outdoor industrial used.

6624. Pesticide Use Records



- (a) The following persons shall maintain records of pesticide use:
 - (1) Any person who uses a pesticide for an agricultural use as defined in Food and Agricultural Code section 11408, other than use on livestock as defined in Food and Agricultural Code section 18663;
 - (2) Any person who uses a pesticide listed in section 6400;
 - (3) Any person engaged for hire in the business of pest control;
 - (4) Any person who uses a pesticide for industrial post-harvest commodity treatment; and
 - (5) Any person who uses a pesticide listed in section 6800(b) for any outdoor institution or outdoor industrial use.

6625. Pesticide Use Report for School Sites and Child Day Care Facilities



- (a) In addition to the reporting requirements of section 6627, persons engaged for hire in the business of pest control at a school site and required to maintain pesticide use records pursuant to section 6624 shall report the use of pesticides to the Director. The report shall be submitted, at least annually, by the 30th day following the end of the calendar year.
- (b) The report shall be on a Department form, School Site and Child Day Care Facility Pesticide Use Reporting by a Business (*DPR-ENF-117 Rev. 12/16*), hereby incorporated by reference, or in a format approved by the Director.

6626. Pesticide Use Reports for Production Agriculture



- (a) The operator of the property which is producing an agricultural commodity shall report the use of pesticides applied to the crop, commodity, or site
- (b) An agricultural pest control business shall report the use of pesticides applied by it for the production of an agricultural commodity
- (c) Each report of pesticide use pursuant to this Section shall be on a department form or in a format approved by the director.....
 - Cal Ag Permits
- (d) A use report required by (a) or (b) for the application of a field soil fumigants in the Sacramento Metro, San Joaquin Valley, South Coast, Southeast Desert, and Ventura ozone nonattainment areas shall include the information specified in 6624(f) in addition to that required by this section.
- (e) If the report is mailed, the postmark shall be the date of delivery. Due by the 10th of the following month work is performed.

6627. Monthly Summary Pesticide Use Reports



- (a) Except as provided in section 6626, persons required to maintain pesticide use records pursuant to section 6624 shall report a summary of the monthly use of pesticides to the commissioner of the county in which the work was performed. The report shall be provided to the commissioner by the 10th day of the month following the month in which the work was performed. If the report is mailed, the postmark shall be the date of delivery.
- (b) The report shall be in a format approved by the director.

6628. Negative Pesticide Use Reports.



- (a) During any month, when a ***licensed agricultural pest control business performs no pest control work*** in a county where the business is registered with the commissioner pursuant to Food and Agricultural Code section 11732, he/she shall submit a report stating this fact to the commissioner, or to the Director in any county where there is no commissioner, by the 10th day of the following month.
- (b) During any month, when a licensed ***structural pest control operator performs no pest control work*** in a county in which he/she is registered with the commissioner pursuant to section 15204 or 15204.5 of the Food and Agricultural Code, he/she shall submit a report stating this fact to the commissioner, or to the Director in any county where there is no commissioner, by the 10th day of the following month.
- (c) If the report is mailed, the postmark shall be the date of delivery.
