CALIFORNIA SHORTHORN BREEDERS ASSOCIATION will award trophies to the Outstanding 4-H and FFA Registered Shorthorn Exhibitors, Competition to run duration of fair, Selection to be based on the following: 1) Dollars Earned. 1 point per dollar earned in individual Registered Shorthorn classes. Top five animals per exhibitor to be considered for points. 2) Presentation in Show Ring. 25 bonus points may be earned based on the following: a) ability to present animals in show ring and, b) showmanship and cooperation in show ring in individual and group classes. 3) Showmanship. 15 points for entering showmanship. Additional 10 points if placed in final lineup of each showmanship division as recorded by fair management. 4) Good Housekeeping. 25 points for good housekeeping and presentation of exhibit in cattle barns. Emphasis will be given to those who perform their own work. At least 3 exhibitors in each division (4-H and FFA) will be given good housekeeping points. In the event of a tie, the committee will conduct interviews to decide the winner.

THE CALIFORNIA POLL-ETTES, INC., Women's Auxiliary of the California Polled Hereford Association, 7775 Old Sacramento Road; Plymouth, California 95669, will award one trophy to the Junior Exhibitor showing the most outstanding POLLED HEREFORD BREEDING ANIMAL. Juniors competing must show a POLLED HEREFORD that is naturally smooth headed or having loose scurs, fitting the American Hereford Association guidelines. Breeding animals, either Bull or Heifer, must be registered with the American Hereford Association. In a mixed breeding show, no polled Hereford placing below 4th place in the show is eligible for this award. The official judge of the Junior Show will make selection, and the worthiness of the exhibit for such an award shall be the sole decision of the judge.

MERCED COUNTY HOLSTEIN ASSOCIATION awards for Outstanding 4-H and FFA Holstein Exhibitors, Competition to run duration of fair. Selection to be based on the following: 1) Dollars Earned, 1 point per dollar earned in individual Registered Holstein classes only. Not more than 1 can be a bull. Top five animals per exhibitor to be considered for points. 2) Good Housekeeping. 25 points for good housekeeping and presentation of animals and exhibit in the barn, and in show ring for duration of fair. Emphasis will be given to those who perform their own work. Showmanship. (Points earned in respective age groups only) 15 points for exhibiting in showmanship, then 5 additional points for placing in final "ribbon" lineup of your Showmanship division (4-H Novice, FFA Senior, etc.) as recorded by fair management; plus 1st place exhibitor in each respective division will get an additional 5 points; 2nd place, 4 points, down to 5th place who will get 1 extra point. No exhibitor can receive more than 25 total Showmanship points. 4) Sportsmanship, Attitude, Behavior and Interview may be included in deciding this award.

OUTSTANDING BEEF, SHEEP, SWINE, GOAT AND RABBIT EXHIBITORS: Plaques will be presented to the Outstanding Beef, Sheep, Swine, Goat and Rabbit Exhibitors in both 4-H and FFA and will be determined by the total amount of premium money won. Premiums won on a maximum of 5 animals only will be considered.

4-H AND FFA CLEAN BARN AWARDS: Clean barn awards will be given to the outstanding 4-H Club and FFA Chapter for the neatest and cleanest barn areas maintained throughout the duration of the fair. Plaques are being donated by Ingraham Trophies of Merced. Judging will take place daily.
