

Northern Spotted Owl Workshops

It has been 20 years since the Northern Spotted Owl has been listed under the Federal Endangered Species List. During this time policies and strategies that guide management of suitable NSO habitat in the coastal ecoregion have evolved and matured to assure and maintain a viable population of owls. In a continuing effort to keep professional managers and landowners informed about administrative policy and procedural changes affecting NSO and timber management these workshops will provide an opportunity for an improved understanding how the changes in agency administration, personnel and policies regarding the NSO will be addressed in the future.

This is our continuing effort to promote the development and communication of timely and relevant changes to NSO management.



Audience: The workshop is intended for anyone involved in the management, and conservation of coast redwood systems having to deal with the protection, protocols and process necessary to protect Northern Spotted Owls. This could

include RPFs, landowners, resource agency staff, land trusts, policy makers, forest managers, etc.
