

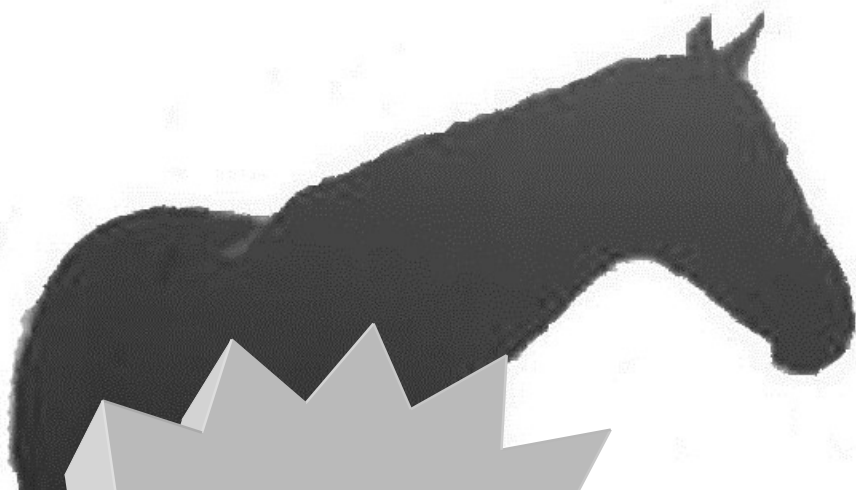

RULES OF ENTRY

1. The Quarter Horse Rule Book will be the guide for this Horse Show.
2. 4-H classes are open to all 4-H'ers in Northern California Counties. **ENTRANT MUST BE A 4-H MEMBER ENROLLED IN A HORSE PROJECT!**
3. Walk-Trot Division 1st & 2nd year members is open to 1st & 2nd year members only. It is intended for members who are not comfortable loping. 1st & 2nd year members who are comfortable loping should enter into classes in their age division (i.e., Jr., Inter., Sr.). Members who enter into Walk-Trot 1st & 2nd year may not cross over into lope classes and must remain in that division all day.
4. 4-H Open classes are open to all age divisions except those exhibitors entered into the Walk/Trot 1st & 2nd year classes.
5. 4-H members, if required by their county, must have a Horse Identification Form on file with their 4-H Office at least 60 days before the event.
6. Long sleeved shirts and boots or show clothes are required in all classes. ASTM approved helmets are required by all exhibitors when mounted on a horse or being pulled by one or more horses. It is recommended that helmets be worn at all times when handling a horse.
7. 4-H whites are optional for showmanship. ASTM helmets are recommended but not required to be worn in showmanship.
8. Management reserves the right to dismiss any horse from the grounds that is handled in such a way as to endanger others.
9. No stallions may be shown in 4-H classes.
10. Entry fee is \$30.00 per day or \$4.99 per class. Entries **MUST BE SIGNED** by parent or guardian.
11. A horse may be used by more than one member of the same immediate family, but can only be used once in any one class.
12. Any horse shown in snaffle may be ridden with 2 hands.
13. No training devices, i.e., sidepulls, martingales, tiedowns, will be allowed in show classes.
14. 4-H Open classes do not count toward high point 4-H awards.

Four in-county and four out-of-county High Point age division silver buckles will be awarded. Rider's points will be accumulated by discipline and their highest English or Western score (not combined) will be used for determining High Point winners. In the event of a tie, the rider placing highest in Horsemanship will win the buckle. High points will be accumulated on a one horse one rider basis. The classes used to determine High Point awards are as follows:

Walk/Trot 1st & 2nd Year Members:

English Points - Showmanship in age group, 7, 12, 18
Western Points - Showmanship in age group, 18, 22, 27

Junior:

English Points - 3, 6, 11, 17
Western Points - 3, 17, 21, 26

Intermediate:

English Points - 2, 5, 10, 16
Western Points - 2, 16, 20, 25


Senior:

English Points - 1, 4, 9, 15
Western Points - 1, 15, 19, 24

4-H Junior Grades	4th & 5th or 9 years old by January 1, 2011.
4-H Intermediate	Grades 6th thru 8th.
4-H Senior	Grades 9th thru 12th.
