WHO SHOULD ATTEND THIS MEETING?

The approximate EGVM quarantine boundary area consists of Park Avenue/Victory Lane on the west, the Summit on the north, Mt. Madonna/Green Valley Road on the east, and Buena Vista/San Andreas Road on the south.

Anyone who grows, harvests, transports, or receives regulated host material* within the quarantine boundary is affected by the quarantine regulations and should attend this meeting.

Regulated host nursery stock is also considered to be a regulated commodity.

Anyone affiliated with handling, transporting or receiving regulated host material should sign a compliance agreement with the EGVM Project.

***Regulated host material is listed on the other side.**

<i>Dianthus spp.</i>	Carnation
<i>Diospyros kaki</i>	Persimmon
<i>Galium mollugo</i>	False Baby's Breath or White Bedstraw
<i>Hypericum calycinum</i>	St. John's Wort or Aaron's Beard
<i>Ligustrum vulgare</i>	European Privet
<i>Olea europaea</i>	Olive
<i>Prunus spp.</i>	Stone Fruit (e.g. apricot, cherry, plum)
<i>Punica granatum</i>	Pomegranate
<i>Rhus glabra</i>	Smooth Sumac
<i>Ribes spp.</i>	Currant, Gooseberry
<i>Rosmarinus officinalis</i>	Rosemary
<i>Rubus spp.</i>	Blackberry, Dewberry
<i>Silene vulgaris</i>	Bladder Campion
<i>Trifolium pratense</i>	Red Clover
<i>Urginea maritima</i>	Sea squill
<i>Vitis spp.</i>	Grape
<i>Ziziphus jujuba</i>	Jujube
