





































Plant Highlights

Rockin' M Rancho

<p>Aloe maculata</p> 	 	<p>Zebra Aloe</p> <p>This succulent is grown for its stunning stripes on pointed leaves of 12" high & wide rosette. It can sucker freely or grow solitary and puts on a show of salmon-pink flowers above 2' high stalks from Spring to Fall. This plant attracts bees, butterflies and birds. Little water once established. Sun to part shade.</p>
<p>Arbutus 'Marina'</p> 	 	<p>This is a small, evergreen tree resembling Arbutus unedo (Strawberry Tree) that is often used as a substitute for Madrone. Grows to 30 feet tall and wide with a handsome trunk of peeling, mahogany bark. Has large leaves and pendulous clusters of rosy pink fall flowers. This tree tolerates many soils and wind. This tree is a good habitat plant for birds and bees. Sun to part shade.</p>
<p>Beschorneria yuccoides</p> 	 	<p>Mexican Lily</p> <p>This evergreen shrub grows in 3' wide clumps of soft, strappy leaves. In early spring, this plant sends out thick, coral-pink flower stalks 3'-6' long. Bell-shaped, yellow-green flowers hang from the pink stalks. A good specimen plant in containers. Full Sun.</p>
<p>Cercis canadensis 'Forest Pansy'</p> 	 	<p>Forest Pansy Eastern Redbud</p> <p>This deciduous tree can reach 15 to 25 feet tall and wide. It has large, heart-shaped, red to purple-tinged leaves that shimmer on graceful, horizontal branches. Fall color is a show of red, purple, orange and yellow. Dark pink flowers appear in late winter before the leaves. Regular water during first year until established, then moderate water. Sun to part shade.</p>
<p>Correa 'Wyn's Wonder'</p> 	 	<p>Wyn's Wonder Australian Fuchsia</p> <p>This dense growing evergreen shrub reaches 2' tall and 5' wide. Olive green leaves have cream colored margins. One inch, rose-pink bell flowers appear repeatedly from Fall to Spring. Needs good drainage and regular watering until established. Sun to part shade.</p>

<p>Euphorbia 'Blue Haze'</p> 	 	<p>Blue Haze Spurge</p> <p>This compact and colorful edger is low maintenance! A very tough groundcover reaching 12" high x 24" wide, it is heat, drought and deer resistant. Showy chartreuse flowers appear in Summer on top of whorled blue-grey foliage. Well-drained soil is best. Full sun.</p>
<p>Euphorbia characias 'Silver Swan'</p> 	 	<p>Mediterranean Spurge</p> <p>This upright perennial provides a year round display of stunning, subtle, silver variegation on grey-green leaves. Low maintenance, drought tolerant and suitable for containers. Flower spikes of green and white in Spring. Full sun.</p>
<p>Galvesia speciosa</p> 	  	<p>Island Bush Snapdragon</p> <p>This fast growing evergreen shrub reaches 3' X 4'. Glossy leaves look great year round. Displays of red, snapdragon-like flowers in Spring attract hummingbirds. It is an excellent groundcover near the coast. Does well in tough soils, including clay. Sun to part shade.</p>
<p>Muehlenbeckia nana</p> 	 	<p>Creeping Wire Vine</p> <p>This lacy textured groundcover with tiny dark green leaves on wiry black stems reaches 3" high x 24" wide. Excellent choice for planting over tree roots; does not compete for water or nutrients. Light foot traffic OK. Drought tolerant and deer resistant. Sun to part shade.</p>
<p>Sedum spathulifolium</p> 	  	<p>Broadleaf Stonecrop</p> <p>This miniature succulent produces mats of 1/2" wide basal rosettes. Small, yellow flowers appear on short stems in Spring & Summer. Grows in a wide range of soils. Sun to part shade.</p>
<p>Verbena lilacina 'De La Mina'</p> 	  	<p>Cedros Island Verbena</p> <p>This 3' high/wide perennial is easy to grow and puts out a profusion of lavender-blue, fragrant flowers in Spring. Attracts butterflies & bees and thrives in a wide range of soils. Excellent choice for containers. Sun to part shade.</p>
