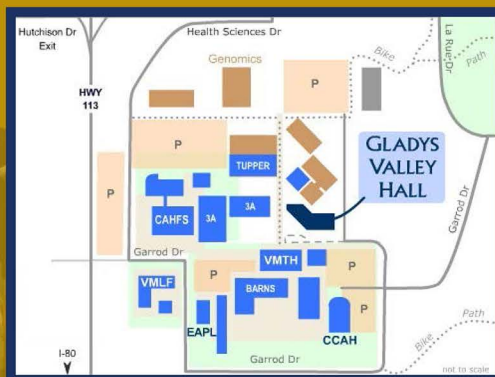
DRIVING DIRECTIONS

FROM SACRAMENTO

Take I-80 West toward San Francisco. Stay on I-80 West toward San Francisco for approximately 15 miles. Take Highway 113 North Exit (to Woodland). Take the first exit (Hutchison Drive) and bear right (east) on Hutchison. Take the second right onto LaRue Road (4-way light). Drive on LaRue until you reach a curve in the road. At the curve, turn right on Garrod Drive. Follow Garrod Drive around to the stop sign. At the stop sign turn right onto Veterinary Medicine Drive, which will wind around Parking Lot #50. Turn left onto Parking Lot #50. There is also parking available next to the Center for Companion Animal Health in Parking Lot #55.

FROM SAN FRANCISCO

FEATURED SPEAKERS

Jeff Stott, PhD

Dr. Jeff Stott received his PhD in Microbiology from Colorado State University in 1982. After receiving a two-year Young Investigator Award from the USDA to study the immunology of the bovine mammary gland, he accepted an appointment to the UC Davis School of Veterinary Medicine as an Assistant Professor in 1983. Dr. Stott continued to work with bluetongue virus and the bovine mammary gland defense system for many years but research on foothill abortion, initiated in 1983, rapidly became his primary focus, and has been for 29 years. Along the way, he has developed a unique international laboratory service for marine mammals (International Laboratory for Marine Mammal Immunology) which has played an integral role in furthering diagnosticst for all types of marine mammals in America, Asia and Europe. Currently, Dr. Stott is an instructor of immunology for undergraduate students in Biological Sciences, graduate students in Comparative Pathology, and first and second year veterinary students.

Lynn Locatelli, DVM

Dr. Lynn Locatelli received her DVM from UC Davis in 1994. She then spent 11 years in a mixed-animal private veterinary practice in Nebraska. While in private practice, she focused her efforts on practicing preventative veterinary care, endpoint management in the feedlot and Bud Williams Low Stress Cattle Handling techniques, as well as practicing general veterinary medicine and surgery. Currently, Dr. Lynn provides consultation and training for Low Stress Cattle Handling, endpoint management services and veterinary care through the services offered by Cattlexpressions.
