



Fruit Tree Bench Grafting Workshop

Saturday, February 23, 2013, from 10:00 am to 1:00pm

Cost \$50 includes taking one tree home!

Come learn the art of bench grafting. Each participant will receive a tutorial, demonstration, practice and will graft one tree to take home. Then hone your skills by grafting additional tree stock for the farm. More trees can be grafted for personal use with an additional fee of \$10.

Instructor: John Valenzuela is a horticulturist, consultant, and educator focused on fruit trees and ecological edible landscapes called 'food forests', while also maintaining a small rare fruit nursery in Novato. He is currently the chairperson of the Golden Gate Chapter of the California Rare Fruit Growers (CRFG), and has been coordinator for their annual Scion Exchange for 3 years. He has led grafting classes for 4 years for the Marin UCCE, in addition to classes through the Ecology Center in Berkeley and other venues throughout the West Coast.
