



## Vegetable Crop Succession & Rotation Planning

Crop succession refers to following one crop with another to maximize use of space. Rotational planting means not growing plants from the same plant family in the same place in consecutive years. What's often challenging is for the gardener with limited space to figure out how to do both and still grow all the crops they want. Instructor **Wendy Krupnick** will explain the details of both of these good gardening practices. She will offer examples of planting schemes that will help with your vegetable garden planning. She will discuss plant families, including which are most important for rigorous rotations as well as those that allow some leeway. Scenarios for both large and small gardens will be explored.



Wendy has had a career in organic gardening and farming for 30 years. She is currently an Adjunct Faculty member at Santa Rosa Junior College Shone Farm. She has also managed variety trials and demonstration gardens at Shepherd's Garden Seeds.
