What is a Green Gardener?

Green Gardeners are landscape maintenance professionals who complete the **San Joaquin County Green Gardener** qualification training offered by UC Cooperative Extension. Green Gardeners will complete almost 20 hours of instruction in landscape maintenance practices that

- conserve water
- reduce greenwaste to the landfills
- reduce the use of pesticides
- prevent polluted runoff water to the Delta

Classes include the following topics:

- Choosing and planting appropriate plant materials for our area
- Understanding soils, and soil/ plant/ water interactions
- Using mulch and compost
- Irrigation scheduling and maintenance
- Turf care and fertilizers
- Integrated pest management: weeds, insects, & diseases
- Pruning shrubs and trees

From I-5 South: Take Lathrop Road or Roth Road exit. Go east to S. Airport Way. Turn left (North) on S. Airport Way, and follow it to Arch-Airport Road. Turn right (East) and go to South B Street. Turn right, go one block to East Earhart Avenue.

From I-5 North: As you near the Port, follow the signs to exit at the right for Downtown Stockton/Fresno Ave./ Highway 4-East, then stay left to merge onto **4-East to 99-South**. Then, follow the directions for **Highway 99** below.

From Highway 99: Take Arch Road exit. Go (West) to Pock Street (large metal sign on the corner says '599 Airpark'). Turn left (south), go one block to East Earhart Avenue, turn right. AG Center is up a block on the right. If you miss Pock, take the next left on B St., and follow it around to the Ag Center.
