- Wrapping instructions: Please use paper plates for exhibiting all food products. Cover with clear plastic (sealed bag or plastic wrap).
- Quantity to bring:
 - Muffins, biscuits, rolls, cookies, candies=1/2 dozen, plus 1 individually wrapped
 - Cakes=1/2 cake, plus 1 slice
 - Bread=1/2 loaf, plus 1 slice
 - Pie=whole pie
- For food safety reasons, please no custards, cheesecakes, or pumpkin pies

Livestock

The 2014 Spring Fair will emphasize showmanship practice.
No market classes will be offered.

General Information

- Exhibitor's age determined as of Dec 31, 2013.
- Only animals owned by the exhibitor are eligible for competition.
- Animals should arrive "show ready". There is extremely limited time to prep before the show.
- All classes of livestock must be ready for judging at 8:30 am. Judging starts at 9:00am.
- Do not bring bedding for the animals.
- Exhibitors must furnish their own feed and watering equipment while at the Spring Fair. The owner of each animal is responsible for the feeding, watering, and care of the animal. Please be sure your animal has an adequate amount of water available.
- Clean stalls is a must. All litter must be removed (taken home) before your animal may leave the grounds.
- Dairy animals and beef cattle must be trained to lead. Unmanageable animals may be disqualified.
- Livestock scales will be open for use.
- ABSOLUTELY no dogs allowed in the livestock area.
- All disqualified animals must be removed from the grounds.

Showmanship Information

- **Members enrolled in more than one project**, may compete in **ONLY ONE** Showmanship event. *Example: if a member is enrolled in a beef and rabbit project, they may only show one of those animals.*
- **Novice** Livestock showmanship is defined as a "member who has **NEVER** shown in **ANY** type of animal as a regular member (beef, sheep, swine, dairy goat, dairy cattle, meat goat, dog, rabbit, poultry, pygmy goat, cavy) showmanship class in a county, district, regional or state fair." Spring Fair, local club events, and years showing as a primary member do not count.
- **Members must be present** at the time the judge calls for a class to begin. They expect promptness.
- **There will not be a round robin** class.

Divisions and Classes

PLEASE NOTE:

- **Showmanship judging** will take place in the following order for each individual animal category (classes will not be held for late arrivals):
 1. **Senior:** 14 & older
 2. **Junior:** 9 - 13 yrs old
 3. **Novice:** member who has never shown any type of animal (as a regular member)
 4. **Primary:** 5 - 8 yrs old

SHOWMANSHIP DIVISIONS:

Primary Members may enter the following Livestock Divisions:

- * RABBIT *CAVY *POULTRY *DOG OBEDIENCE
- *PYGMY GOAT *NIGERIAN DWARF GOAT

Junior and Senior Members may enter the following small and large animal Livestock Divisions:

- *RABBIT *CAVY *POULTRY *DOG OBEDIENCE *PYGMY GOAT *BEEF
- *DAIRY GOAT/MEAT GOAT *DAIRY CATTLE *SWINE
- *SHEEP *NIGERIAN DWARF GOAT

Showmanship Classes

DIVISION 10 - Rabbits

- Rabbits will not be cooped. They must be in individual carriers with secure lids.
- All rabbits must be tattooed prior to Spring Fair day
- Must be purebred only
- Bring ice bottles if weather is hot
- Maximum of three (3) animals. No does with litters

DIVISION 13 - Poultry

- Exhibitors must be at their coops at the time of judging
- Coops will be assigned by club. Each exhibitor is responsible for ensuring that their birds are in their proper coops, fed and watered
- Any bird showing signs of illness or fatigue may be disqualified by the judge
- Any bird found with lice will be disqualified
- All state and local rules will apply

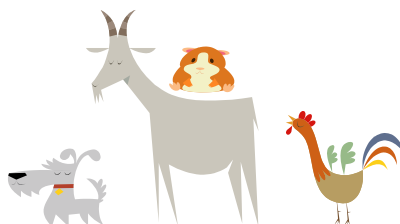

Dog Care and Training (con't)

DIVISION 15 - Obedience

Class 1 - Primary

Class 2 - Sub-novice A: 1st year for dog and 1st year for exhibitor. All exercises done on a 6 foot leash-healing figure 8, stand for examination, recall, long sit for one minute, and long down for 3 minutes

Class 3 - Sub-novice B: 2nd year and over for the exhibitor and 1st year for the dog. All exercises are done on a 6 foot leash.

Class 4 - Novice: 2nd year for the dog. Heel and figure 8 on leash, heel on and off leash, stand for examination off leash, long sit for one minute off leash, long down for three minutes off leash.

Class 5 - Graduate Novice: 3rd year for the dog. Heel on and off leash, heel and figure 8 off leash, stand for examination off leash, drop on recall, long sit for three minutes leash - out of sight, long down for five minutes off leash and out of sight.
