Join University of California scientists as we examine the characteristics of wildfire and its impacts on Sierra Nevada forests and CA spotted owls. We will look at land management practices used to affect fire behavior and how the landscape recovers from fire. We will take a field trip to the 2014 King fire area to see effects of high severity fire on forest regeneration and wildlife. The training will include nature journaling, native storytelling and an art session.
