

## 2017-18 4-H FAIR REQUIREMENTS TO EXHIBIT AT THE GLENN COUNTY FAIR

The Glenn County 4-H Council annually reviews and sets fair requirements. For the 2017-2018 program year, the requirements to be met are:

If applicable, the Across Project, Club, or County form must be completed and approved by the first Monday in December (**Monday, December 4, 2017**), of the program year. If not, then the member is not eligible to exhibit at Fair. Appeal to Council for extenuating circumstances after deadline.

### Primary Fair Participation Requirements

---

In order to be eligible to exhibit at the Fair, members must complete the following:

1. Complete a minimum of six (6) hours of 4-H instruction in project area.
2. Be enrolled in 4-H by the last Monday in September for returning members and the second Monday in October for new members.

### Anything But Animals / Still Exhibits / Fair Participation Requirements

---

In order to be eligible to exhibit Anything But Animals / Still Exhibit projects at the fair, members must complete the following:

1. Attend 70% of Club meetings as an enrolled member prior to the Fair entry form deadline. Maximum of two (2) meetings may be made up with a Key Leader approval prior to fair entry forms deadline (See Make Up Policy).
2. Be enrolled in 4-H by the last Monday in September for returning members and the second Monday in October for new members.
3. Turn in completed record book or minimum required (see Project Completion Requirements and [Steps to Success in 4-H](#)) at the end of the previous program year (June 30<sup>th</sup>) with all required signatures.
4. Complete a minimum of 6 hours of 4-H instruction in project area.
5. Participate in a countywide 4-H event in project area: Anything But Animals Judging Day, Fashion Revue, and Food Fiesta, Creative Arts and Skills Day, or approved make-up event.
6. Give a presentation at a Club meeting, Project meeting, Council meeting, County level event, or County Presentation Day. **OR** be an evaluator or be a Room Coordinator at County/Sectional Presentation Day. To qualify as an evaluator, member must have given one gold presentation in the past and must be a Senior Member. To be a room coordinator, member must have given one gold presentation in the past and must be 13 years or older as of December 31, 2017.

### Livestock Fair Participation Requirements

---

In order to be eligible to exhibit an animal at the Fair, including Replacement Heifers, members must complete the following:

1. Attend 70% of Club meetings prior to the Fair entry form deadline. Maximum of two (2) meetings may be made up with a Key Leader approval prior to Fair entry forms deadline (See Make Up Policy).
2. Be enrolled in 4-H by the last Monday in September for returning members and the second Monday in October for new members.
3. Turn in completed record book or minimum required (see Project Completion Requirements and [Steps to Success in 4-H](#)) at the end of the previous program year (June 30<sup>th</sup>) with all required signatures.
4. Complete a minimum of 6 hours of 4-H instruction in project area.
5. Participate in the Livestock Challenge or Livestock Field Day, or approved make-up event.
6. Complete Animal Ethics Training every program year.
7. Give a presentation at a Club meeting, Project meeting, Council meeting, County level event, or County Presentation Day. **OR** be an evaluator or be a Room Coordinator at County/Sectional Presentation Day. To qualify as an evaluator, member must have given one gold presentation in the past and must be a Senior Member. To be a room coordinator, member must have given one gold presentation in the past and must be 13 years or older as of December 31, 2017.
8. May only sell one (1) market animal (Dairy and Beef Replacement Heifers are not considered market).
