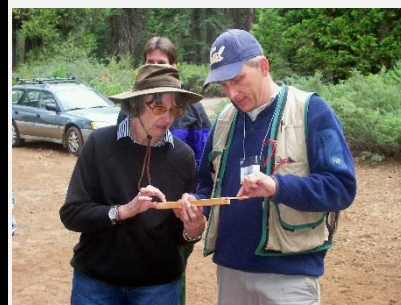

California Forest Stewardship Workshop

March 7th, 8th & 14th: Shasta College, Room 1213, 11555 Old Oregon Trail, Redding, CA

The goal of the workshop is to help landowners understand and protect their forests by creating a Forest Management Plan. The workshop will cover:

- Forest management objectives and planning
- Forest health, insects and disease
- Forest and fire ecology, wildlife, watersheds
- Fuels reduction and forest resource marketing
- Mapping, inventory and silviculture
- Project development & permitting
- Getting professional help and cost-share opportunities

Days one and two will consist of classroom and forest-based instruction on ecological concepts and measurement skills. After a week's break to collect information on their own property, participants will return for day three to write up their management plans. Participants who complete their plans will be eligible for a free visit by a Registered Professional Forester to assess its content.
