

Introduction to the Pollinator presentations

If this is your first time using MGPC presentation from this web site, it is recommended that you try downloading a presentation (or two) and its associated material to help you figure out how it all works. Be sure to save all downloaded files under different but associated names so that you can tell your files from the ones on the web site. You might want to enlist the aid of someone who has done it before or at least who regularly gives presentation – ask around or send out a general email to see who would be willing and has time to work with you.

This group of presentations may seem to be complicated but was included in this way to allow flexibility for those who need that as well as ready presentations on set portions of the topic. If you know PowerPoint, you can use the modularized files to customize a presentation. For those who don't know the tool or need something ready-made, the All Pollinators presentation provides a good overview and introduction to the various pollinators. The Butterflies presentation can be used for a more directed, in-depth coverage of butterflies as pollinators. Each of these comes complete with handouts. If you decide to use the modularized presentations, you can use any of the handouts from All Pollinators and Butterflies. Also check the public website to determine which, if any, you want to suggest to your audience.

Remember: If you decide you need to add slides with NEW content, these must go through the SIM process. You can move slides with approved content around to suit your presentation style.

Introduction to the modularized Pollinator presentations

The following sets of files can be used to customize a presentation. The Habitat module is the starting point in all cases and can be used as a stand alone if it covers the topic you are presenting. You can add any or all slides from the other files depending upon your focus on bees, butterflies, and or hummingbirds. Be sure that you start with the downloaded files, renamed to suit your conventions. It is suggested that you then make a copy of the Habitat file, again with a different name (perhaps add 'working' or some such), and then copy in additional slides from the other files. Remember: if you add NEW content, it must go through the SIM process to be vetted and approved.

Who Are the Pollinators?

Module Bees Ppt Slides – This file has 21 slides which introduce not only bees as pollinators but also wasps, beetles, and flies. Included information introduces native bees and nesting requirements to insure continues populations.

Now, on to Butterflies . . .

Module Butterflies Ppt Slides – This file has 34 slides which introduce the California state insect, describe habit requirements for all stages of a butterfly's life, challenge the audience to identify specific butterflies, and cover a bit about Monarch butterflies.

And now, Hummingbirds . . .

Module Hummingbirds Ppt Slides – This file has 11 slides that detail facts about hummingbirds, presents local hummingbirds, and introduces the topic of flowers
