Sun Perennials (*means they can tolerate some shade; **means mostly shade/filtered sun)				
Aloe arborescens	Succulent	2	South Africa native. Blooms: Vermillion (occasionally yellow) winter flowers held above foliage in spiky clusters; Forms a large rounded shrub; Height/Width: 10 ft high and wide; Exposure: Full sun but tolerates some shade; Water Needs: Little to moderate water.	
Agave americana	CENTURY PLANT, Blue/Green Agave	1	Native to Mexico. Yellow Ribbons 4-6 ft high by 6-8 ft wide; Irrigation: Low Water Needs; Blue/Green, 4x4 ft.; Exposure: Full Sun; Irrigation: Water occasionally. After first season, they need NO water.	
Anigozanthos flavidus	Yellow Kangaroo Paw	1	Evergreen native in western Australia. Blooms: Late Spring to Fall; Height: 5 ft.; Width: 2-3 ft.; Exposure: Full Sun; Irrigation: Regular Water	

<p>Asparagus ornamental</p>	<p>Common Asparagus Fern</p>	<p>1</p>	<p>Native to South Africa. Tiny, fragrant white flowers in loose clusters; these are followed by brown berries. Height/Width: 1-3 feet; Exposure: Full Sun to Part Shade; Irrigation: Low Water Needs.</p>	
<p>Aspidistra elatior</p>	<p>Cast Iron Plant</p>	<p>1</p>	<p>Native of China. Spreads slowly by rhizomes. Leaf blades are 1 - 2-1/2 ft.long, 3-4 in. wide; Height: 1-3 ft., Width: 3 ft.; Exposure: Partial or Full Shade, bright to dim light; Irrigation: Moderate to Regular Water.</p>	
<p>Buddleja globosa</p>	<p>BUTTERFLY BUSH, Orange</p>	<p>7</p>	<p>Native to Chile. Height/Width: 10-15 ft.; Blooms: Late Spring to Early Summer; Exposure: Full Sun to Light Shade; Irrigation: Moderate to Regular Water</p>	

<p>Calandrinia spectabilis</p>	<p>ROCK PURSLANE</p>	<p>1</p>	<p>Native to Chile. Bloom: From spring into fall produces magenta blooms; Height: 12-18 inches; Width: 4 ft.; Exposue: Full Sun; Irrigation: Moderate Water</p>	
<p>Cotoneaster microphyllus</p>	<p>ROCKSPRAY COTONEASTER, Evergreen</p>	<p>1</p>	<p>Native to China, Himalayas, northern India. Height: 2-3 ft.; Width: 6 ft.; Exposure: Full Sun; Irrigation: Little to Moderate Water</p>	
<p>Eremophila glabra</p>	<p>COMMON EMU BUSH</p>	<p>3</p>	<p>Native of Australia. Variable species with creeping or upright growth to 5 ft. tall, 3-10 ft. wide. Flowers in early spring to autumn. Exposure: Full Sun; Irrigation: Little to Moderate Water.</p>

Hylocereus Undatus	Dragon Fruit - Halley's Comet	2	A climbing plant. Plant in a well draining soil with a support stake or trellis and water when dry. Protect from hard freezes. Plant in full sun.	
Iris unguicularis	Algerian Blue Iris	3	Native of Greece, the Near East, northern Africa. Height/Spread: 1-2 ft.; Exposure: Full Sun; Irrigation: Low Water.	
*Lavandula dentata	FRENCH LAVENDER	1	Native to mountains of southern Europe. Long spring-into-summer flowering period; Height: 2-3 ft.; Width: 4-5 ft.; Exposure: Full Sun; Irrigation: Low Water Needs	

<p>*Liriope spicata</p>	<p>CREEPING LILY TURF</p>	<p>2</p>	<p>Native of Asia. Plants look best from spring until cold weather arrives. Height: 3/4 ft. to 1-1/2 ft.; Width: 1-2 ft. spread; Exposure: Full Sun to Part Shade; Irrigation: Regular Water.</p>	
<p>*Lobelia laxiflora</p>	<p>Mexican Lobelia</p>	<p>1</p>	<p>Native to Arizona and Mexico; Bloom: bears tubular orange-red flowers over a long summer; Height: 3 ft.; Width: 3-6 ft.; Exposure: Full Sun to Light Shade; Irrigation: Low Water (Can be invasive with lots of water.)</p>	
<p>Salvia x jamensis</p>	<p>Salvia James Compton</p>	<p>7</p>	<p>Found wild in Mexico. Habit varies from upright to horizontal, but plants are usually 3 ft. tall, with fairly open branching; Exposure: Best in moderate climates without extreme temperature swings. Irrigation: Drought tolerant but best with moderate water.</p>	

Botanical Name	Common Name	No. of Plants	Description	Picture
Tagetes lemmonii	COPPER CANYON DAISY	6	Native to Mexico, Central America. Golden orange flowers are carried at branch ends sporadically all year, peaking in winter and spring. Height: 3-6 ft., Width: same; Exposure: Full Sun; Irrigation: Moderate to Regular Water.	
Verbena rigida	Tall Verbena	2	Native to South America. Blooms in summer and fall. Creeping rootstock forms low foliage rosette 4-8 in. high, 1 ft. wide. Exposure: Full Sun; Irrigation: Moderate to regular water.	
Salvia mellifera	Black Sage	2	Native to coastal California and Baja California. Blooms: In spring bears tightly packed whorls of small whitish or lavender-tinged flowers; Height: 3-6 ft.; Width: 3-5 ft.; Exposure: Full Sun; Irrigation: Drought Tolerant, Regular to Low Water Needs.

Symphotrichum chilense	Pacific Aster or California Aster	7	It is native to western North America from British Columbia to California. Bloom: July to August; Height: 1.3-3.3 ft; Width: 3 ft.; Exposure: Part Shade, Full Sun; Irrigation: Very Low Water Needs
