	Cucumber, Cool Customer	Hybrid. A rugged pickler. 4-5" fruits on vigorous plants. small seed cavities and exceptional crunch and flavor. Plants do well against late season stress and diseases.
	Cucumber, Early Spring	Hybrid. Long, slender cukes offer a crisp, mild, bitter-free and burpless bite all season long. Stake them to get straight cukes, or let them curl on the ground. Don't need peeling.
	Cucumber, Marketmore	Heirloom. Popular Variety Is A Consistent Producer Of Delicious, Mildly Sweet Cucumbers With Dark Green Protective Skin. A favorite slicer for the home garden. A standard for American slicers.
	Cucumber, Spacemaster 80	Compact Cucumber Ideal For Containers or raised beds. Great for pickling when small. Short Hardy Vines, Dark Green Fruits 7.5" Long. Prolific And Great as a slicer when larger... Height 6-8"; Spread 2-3 ft.
	Cucumber, Sweet Green Armenian	Heirloom. Creamy pale green long ridged fruits. Never need peeling. Crisp and juicy. Thrive in hot summers. Never bitter. Heavy yielders.
	Eggplant, Black Beauty	Heirloom, Black Beauty has set the standard since 1902 for large, high-quality fruit. Outstanding when harvested at their peak, the skin is tender, so no need to peel it.
	Eggplant, Long Purple	Heirloom. Long slender purple variety not usually found in grocery stores. Pretty and delicious. May need staking in the garden.
	Eggplant, Rosa Bianca	Elegant heirloom eggplant from Sicily. Light pink-lavender fruit has soft white shading and a gently scalloped form. Mild flesh is very popular with chefs and gardeners alike! No bitterness. A great variety for heirloom growers.




	<p>Greens, Broccoli rabe</p>	<p>Broccoli rabe, aka <i>rapini</i> (cabbage family). 6 to 9 inch stalk and broccoli-like clusters. Has a strong, spicy taste. If you like arugula, you might like broccoli rabe. All parts edible. Harvest BEFORE bolting. Can bolt overnight!! Likes cool weather.</p>
	<p>Greens, Common Chives</p>	<p>Both the greens and the unopened immature flower buds can be chopped and used in soups, in omelettes, potatoes, and salads. Flowers attract pollinators. Beware of gophers. Protect in a gopher cage if possible as they will last for years.</p>
	<p>Greens, Red Malabar Spinach</p>	<p>Open pollinated. Heat loving salad or stir-fry green. Glossy, thick, savoyed leaves resemble spinach. Mild Swiss chard taste. Use leaves and young stems sparingly in salads or stir-fry. Pinch tips to encourage branching.</p>
	<p>Herb, 'Sprint' Salad scallions</p>	<p>Vigorous scallions (a.k.a. "green onions"), with snowy white flesh & deep green stalks, tender texture. Gentle onion flavor is a salad essential. Harvest before bloom stalks come up.</p>
	<p>Herb, Basil Sweet Thai</p>	<p>Try it as a garnish for sweet dishes. Green, 2" long leaves have a spicy, anise/clove flavor. Edible Flowers: Use the flowers in any recipe that calls for basil, or to garnish drinks, salads, soups, pasta, and desserts.</p>
	<p>Herb, Basil Cardinal</p>	<p>Cardinal Red Blooms Are A Striking Addition To Any Herb Garden. Strong, Burgundy Stems Hold Fragrant, Tasty, Bright Green Leaves. Vibrant And Colorful Throughout Summer. Also Great For Pesto. Height 14-20"</p>

	Peppers, Altiplano, Serrano	Large-fruited serrano. An impressive size at 4 1/2-5" long, Altiplano peppers are faster to harvest than types with smaller fruits. Medium-large plants. Hot- 5,000-30,000 Scoville units.
	Peppers, Ancho/Poblano	Very popular chile in Mexico. Often stuffed with cheese or meat for chile rellenos or dried (ancho) and used for sauces like mole. 1,000-2,000 Scoville units.
	Peppers, Canary Bell	Superior sweet pepper, medium-sized, thick-walled green Fruit ripensing to bright yellow color. Sets early and produces all summer. Superb in salads, and a premier type for grilling. Exceptional flavor, very productive.







	<p>Peppers, Early Jalapeno</p>	<p>Best combination of earliness and yield in a jalapeno. Fruits avg. 3.5-4", and can be harvested early or allowed to check (small cracks in skin). Hot weather makes hotter peppers. 4,000-6,000 Scoville units.</p>
	<p>Peppers, Habanero</p>	<p>This dainty little orange pepper is among the hottest peppers anywhere, Habanero delivers a searing 215,000 Scovilles. These little peppers look harmless, but use them sparingly, and remember wear gloves when handling them to avoid transferring that heat to your eye.</p>
	<p>Peppers, Jedi (Jalapeno)</p>	<p>Our largest Jalapeño, Jedi's fruits avg. 4-4 1/2" and are slow to check (show small cracks in skin). The large plant is of the "continuous set" type that produces over a long harvest window. 2,500-3,600 Scoville units.</p>
	<p>Peppers, Jimmy Nardello</p>	<p>One Of The Sweetest Non-Bell Peppers You'll Ever Taste. Bright Red, 6" To 8" Long Peppers Are About 1" Wide And Somewhat Wrinkled In Appearance. Great For Frying Or Salads. Expect Large Yields. 0 to 100 Scoville units.</p>
	<p>Peppers, Marconi Golden</p>	<p>Classic Italian sweet peppers, seeds are from the golden colored form. Fruits have a blocky shape and can grow to about 6-7". Skin ripens to a beautiful golden yellow, with a wonderful flavor. Fruits are popularly fried or roasted.</p>
	<p>Peppers, Marconi Red</p>	<p>Wonderful Sweet Long Red Italian-Style Peppers (Up To 12" Long X 3" Across); Good Producer; Thin Walled. Ripens From Green To Red. Good Green Or Mature; Good For Salads And Frying. A Master Gardener favorite. 0 Scoville units.</p>

	<p>Peppers, Shishito</p>	<p>Avg. 3–3 1/2" fruits are thin-walled and have no heat. Popular in Japan, where its thin walls make it particularly suitable for tempura. Also very good roasted, in stir-fries, or sautéed.</p>
	<p>Squash Summer, Scallop Early White</p>	<p>Heirloom bush variety; ancient Patty Pan squash, prized by native Americans and settlers. Its culinary uses are almost endless - can be steamed, baked, grilled with butter, used in breads, casseroles! High in Vit A.</p>
	<p>Squash Summer, Zucchini, Golden</p>	<p>Slender, bright golden-yellow fruit. As delicious as they are attractive. Distinctive zucchini flavor. Prefers heavily amended soil.</p>
