



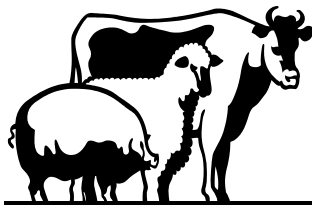

## Event Guidelines

*pertains to ALL DIVISIONS*

1. Division Entries (large animal, small animal and still exhibits) may be removed from the grounds when each of the Divisions have been cleared by their Division Chair (page 4).
2. Judging events may overlap. Please check-in with each Division you have entered on the morning of 4-H Field Day. Classes will not be delayed if a 4-H member is not present when called.
3. Primary members must be 5 years old, and not older than 8 years old as of December 31 of the current program year (12/31/2022).
4. Primary members may not participate in any Large Animal Science projects (beef, dairy goat, market goat, sheep, swine.) **All animal species Level Testing is open to Primary Members.**
5. **Primary members will receive Participation Ribbons only.**
6. You will be given instructions for parking vehicles and trailers when you arrive via the Rodeo Gate to unload. If not, **PLEASE ASK!**
7. When parking to deliver animals or still exhibits, keep the Fire Lane clear at ALL times.
8. **NO PARKING OR DRIVING ON GRASSY AREAS IS ALLOWED. VIOLATORS WILL BE HELD RESPONSIBLE FOR ALL DAMAGE.**
9. **Limited Parking for trucks and trailers will be in LOT H.**
10. Park in designated areas only.
11. Handicap Parking sites will be marked & available inside the grounds.
12. There is no 4-H uniform requirement for participation at 4-H Field Day.

## Event Code of Conduct

*Please Read Carefully*

The following behavior guidelines and expectations are designed to make everyone's experience at 4-H events satisfying to all attending. This means that all participants, members, adult volunteers, and 4-H YDP staff, shall adhere to the core values of the University of California 4-H Youth Development Program, respect the individual rights, safety, and property of others. Youth are expected to demonstrate the character traits of trustworthiness, respect, responsibility, fairness, caring, and citizenship.

## EVENT CODE OF CONDUCT—Continued

While attending all 4-H meetings, projects, programs, and events as a 4-H member I will:

1. Be nice, kind, helpful, and respectful to other 4-H members; and to adult volunteers, youth leaders, 4-H staff, and other adults in charge.
2. Be honest, honor my commitments, and accept responsibility for my choices.
3. Use language that is respectful and kind. Not use curse words.
4. Wear appropriate clothes that are allowed by 4-H rules.
5. Not have or use alcohol, tobacco (like cigarettes, e-cigarettes, or chew) or other drugs (unless my doctor gives them to me).
6. Not bother or attack others, not carry or use a weapon; and not do anything else illegal or unsafe.
7. Certified 4-H adult volunteers can search my things (like my backpack) if they think I might have broken the 4-H rules.
8. Not touch anyone in a way that is too affectionate, and not engage in sexual behavior.
9. Follow the 4-H Guidelines for Social Media.
10. Not do things out of 4-H that are harmful to anyone in 4-H or the 4-H program.

### CONSEQUENCES

Anyone who sees someone break the Member Code of Conduct should tell the adult in charge right away. That adult will tell that member's parent or guardian. Consequences for breaking the 4-H rules may include:

- Sending the member home.
- Having the member meet with 4-H adults, talk about how the member can learn from what they've done, and decide what the member should do to make up for any harm done.
- Charging the member (or their parents/guardians) for the cost of repairs to property that the member damaged.
- Giving the member a warning, barring them from future events, suspending their membership, or terminating their membership.
- Taking the member to the nearest law enforcement agency or other proper authority.

### SILENT AUCTION RULES/GUIDELINES

---

- Persons under 18 years of age may not place bids on Silent Auction items. **If an underage person places a winning bid on an item, the parent and/or guardian will be responsible for payment of that item.**
- There will be items that you must be 21 years or older to bid on.
- **Please include your cellphone number on the Bid Sheet when making a bid so that you can be contacted on Saturday, June 3, 2023 when the Silent Auction has concluded.**
- There will be four (4) individual Sections of Silent Auction items, Section One will close at 10:30 a.m., the Second closes at 11:00 a.m., the Third closes at 11:30 a.m. and the Forth section will close at Noon.
- Bidders should check to see if they have won an item in the Intervals mentioned above.
- **Items must be paid for and picked up by 12:30 p.m. on Saturday, June 3, 2023.** *Any item not paid for and picked up by that time, will go to the next highest bidder. No Winning Bids will have their items delivered to the SLO County 4-H office. All items must be picked up on the day of 4-H Field Day by 1:00 p.m.*
- Cash, Checks will be accepted and Debit/Credit Cards will be accepted using a UC ANR Survey Portal or the CA 4-H Foundation online tools.

### LARGE ANIMAL LEVEL TESTING Levels I, II, III – Beef, Dairy Goats, Market Goats, Sheep & Swine, & Horse Level 1-4

- Large Animal Level Tests are taken from 4-H Curriculum books, which can be viewed on the county website: [https://ucanr.edu/sites/slo4-h/Club\\_Forms/Level\\_Testing/](https://ucanr.edu/sites/slo4-h/Club_Forms/Level_Testing/)
- Each Test Level corresponds with the Curriculum book level.
- Level Testing is open to all 4-H members.
- **Sign up for the online Level Tests at 4-H Field Day . Sign-ups are due online, Friday, May 28, 2023.**
- You do not have to show an animal in order to take a Level Test.

## LARGE ANIMAL LEVEL TESTING Continued –



- Members may sign up for only **two** Level Test per species, but may sign up for multiple species. **All tests must be started by 12:30 p.m.**
- Members who pass the same level for all species (beef, sheep, swine and goat – members have the choice to take either the dairy or market goat test) will receive a special Master Level pin in recognition of their achievement. Pins will be awarded for Levels, I, II, and III
- Tests will be graded on-site. Pins will be handed out once graded.
- **A Passing rate of 70% is required for completion of each level.**

### Small Animal Level Testing

- Small Animal Level Testing will be offered at 4-H Field Day and is open to all 4-H members.

- **Sign up for the online Level Tests at 4-H Field Day . Sign-ups are due online, Friday, May 28, 2023.**
- You do not have to show an animal at 4-H Field Day in order to take a Level Test.
- Members may sign up for only **two** Level Test per species, but may sign up for multiple species. **All tests must be started by 12:30p.m.**
- **A Passing rate of 70% is required for completion of each level.**
- Tests will be graded on-site. Pins will be awarded on-site.

## LARGE ANIMAL SCIENCE

**ENTRY FEE: \$10.00 for SLO COUNTY 4-H FIELD DAY**

Participant must be 9 years of age as of 12/31/2022 and up to 19 years of age as of 12/31/2022.

### LARGE ANIMAL SCIENCE GUIDELINES

1. Large Animals will be accepted at 6:30 a.m. and must be in place by 8:00 a.m.
2. **Novice Class definition: “never shown any large animal before”**  
- a member who has never shown any large animal (beef, dairy goat, market goat, sheep, swine) before at any event.
3. **Junior/Senior Class definition: “having shown any large animal before”** - a member who has shown any large animal (beef, dairy goat, market goat, sheep, swine) before at any event.
4. **4-H members will be judged on Showmanship only.**
5. Members are responsible for fitting their own animals and only members may help one another. **NOTE: Animals should be brought to the event groomed and ready to show. Touch-up only will be allowed on the fairgrounds. No washing or clipping of animals on the fairgrounds. Fitting Tables for Goats and Sheep are allowed.**  
—> **NO BLOCKING CHUTES WILL BE ALLOWED** <—
6. **Members must bring their own pen clean-up equipment.**
7. Ownership papers are **not** required.
8. **Failure to clean the Club Division Pen areas, will result in a fine to the 4-H Club** and will not be allowed to participate at future 4-H Field Days.
9. **Limited to showing one (1) large animal per Division.**
10. **All Large Animal Science Divisions will have a Showmanship Demonstration BEFORE the actual Showmanship Competition begins.**
11. **NOTE: There is no 4-H uniform requirement in the 4-H Youth Development Program.** If you have any questions call the 4-H office, (805) 781-5943.
12. **All Animals must be healthy and in good form.** Any animals that are ill or have parasites, or external skin issues, **may not be brought onto the grounds.**



## **DIVISION 350 BEEF**

- Participant must be 9 years of age as of 12/31/2022 and up to 19 years of age as of 12/31/2022.
- Must be enrolled in **Beef Project**.
- Members may show a steer or heifer in showmanship.
- The top two showpersons of each class will be invited to compete in the next upper division class.
- **No hay is allowed inside the arena.**
- **Members must bring own clean-up supplies (e.g. rakes, shovels).**
- It is recommended you feed your animal before coming to the event. However, if feeding is necessary during the event, you *may feed grain inside* the arena, **or you may feed hay outside** the arena by tying your animal to your trailer or a fence.
- **Hoof Trimming will be done by Bryan Coy (Approx. Cost: \$50/head) - Text Division Lead Kristin Beljean if you plan on attending for this Hoof Trimming Service.**

- **Primary members will receive Participation Ribbons only.**

### SMALL ANIMAL SCIENCE GUIDELINES

1. Small animals (dogs, rabbits) will be accepted at 6:30 a.m. and must be in place by 8:00 a.m.
2. **Dogs can start to arrive at 7:30 a.m. and must be in place by 8:45 a.m. — Check-in starts at 8:15 a.m. see Tentative Schedule on page 31.**
3. All small animals must be contained or restrained properly (on leashes, in cages, etc.)
4. Small animals must not be left alone.
5. Small animals should have plenty of water at all times.
6. If you need to be at another event or exhibit, you need to make arrangements for someone to care for your animal.
7. Note: **There is no uniform requirement** in the 4-H Youth Development program. If you have any questions call the 4-H office, at (805) 781-5943.
8. **NOTE: *No Family Pet Dogs will be allowed on the grounds. Only those dogs entering Showmanship and Obedience classes are allowed on the grounds. Please leave your family pet dogs at home. Thank you.***



## DIVISION 451 DOG CARE & TRAINING

- Participant must be 5 years of age as of 12/31/2022 and up to 19 years of age as of 12/31/2022.
- **Primary members will receive Participation Ribbons only.**
- Must be enrolled in **Dog Project**.
- All dogs MUST BE RESTRAINED properly (have a leash).
- **If your female dog is "in season", she can not be brought to this event.**
- If the entry level for any Obedience class is too large, the class may be split by age group.

1. If you have entered a Large Animal or Small Animal project for 4-H Field Day in addition to a Still Exhibit, please check-in your animal entry(ies) first.
2. Still Exhibit entries will be accepted **at 7:30 a.m.** by a representative of the Division **and must be in place by 9:00 a.m.**
3. All entries must have been made during the current 4-H program year: July 2022—May 2023.
4. **All Still Exhibit entries must be picked up at the end of 4-H Field Day. Please make arrangements for someone to pick up your entry(ies) from the Estrella Hall if you have to leave early. Neither 4-H, nor the Paso Robles Event Center, is responsible for any damages. All Still Exhibits need to be picked up by 1:00 p.m.**
5. All Still Exhibit Divisions are open to all 4-H members.
6. **Note: For Division 559: All 4-H Project Posters/Collages must be created with a Vertical (up and down) Orientation due to hanging space limitations.**
7. If you need to leave early, Still Exhibit entries can be picked up as soon as judging is over and the area has been Opened to the Public. *Any Still Exhibit entries left on the table(s) at the end of 4-H Field Day event will be discarded.*
8. **PINEWOOD DERBY RACES will be held in Estrella Hall — see page 21 for more details and information.**

## DIVISION 550 BIRDHOUSES

- Participant must be 5 years of age as of 12/31/2022 and up to 19 years of age as of 12/31/2022.
- **Primary members will receive Participation Ribbons only.**
- You may enter **one (1)** exhibit in this division.
- This division is open to all 4-H members.
- Judging is based on the Danish System.
- Class winners will receive a rosette.

- 10 – Primary, 5 years old and not older than 8 years old by 12/31/2022.
- 11 – Junior, 9 to 10 years of age
- 12 – Intermediate, 11 to 13 years of age
- 13 – Senior, 14 to 19 years of age

## DIVISION 551 EXPRESSIVE / FINE ARTS

- Participant must be 5 years of age as of 12/31/2022 and up to 19 years of age as of 12/31/2022.
- **Primary members will receive Participation Ribbons only.**
- This division is open to all 4-H members.
- You may only enter **one (1)** exhibit in this division.
- Exhibits in this division include, but are not limited to leather crafts, sewn craft items, jewelry making, macramé, decoupage, stained glass, bead craft, candle making, soap making, puppetry, paper craft, non-wearable needle arts, graphic arts, drawing, painting, woodworking, metal working, and scrapbooking—see Scrapbooking guidelines on next page **and all other creative items can go in this Division.**

## DIVISION 551 EXPRESSIVE / FINE ARTS—Continued

- Member may only present current year Scrapbook with 8 pg. minimum.
- **Primary Members may submit one album with a minimum of 4 pages completed. Works in progress will be accepted.**
- Include an Artist Page in the back cover of the album that contains the member's name, club, and age on it.
- When journaling in his/her own handwriting, the member needs to exercise neatness with creativity.
- It is important to keep in mind the proper placement of photos and other memorabilia. Use chronology (putting things in order of occurrence), seasonal/special events, or activities to organize the scrapbook. Remember the scrapbook is telling a story.
- Pages need to be titled & pictures must be labeled with name(s), date, and the event. NO DUPLICATES unless it is part of the page design elements. Always answer: Who, What, When, Where.
- Use journaling along with photos and memorabilia. Without journaling, photos and memorabilia become less meaningful over time.
- Use a variety of cropping techniques and page layouts. This will add interest and creativity to the album. Use good page element; focus on picture preservation and use creativity/resourcefulness with handmade or recycled embellishments and mementos.
- The scrapbook should show a good sense of the project and build a story of memories.
- Judging is based on the Danish System.
- Class winners will receive a rosette.

## DIVISION 553 PINEWOOD DERBY RACES

- Participant must be 5 years of age as of 12/31/2022 and up to 19 years of age as of 12/31/2022.
  - **Primary members will receive Participation Ribbons only.**
  - This division is open to all 4-H members.
  - You may only enter **one (1)** pinewood derby car to race.
- ⇒ **Rules for Construction of Cars:** Each car must pass inspection by the official inspection committee before it will be allowed to compete. In order to race in the competition, the car must adhere to the following Rules. If you have any questions about the Rules, contact **troygood@gmail.com**
- ⇒ Must use official Pinewood Derby kit supplied by 4-H group.
- ⇒ The car weight shall not exceed 5.0 ounces. The official race scale shall be considered final.
- ⇒ The overall length of the car shall not exceed 7 inches.
- ⇒ The overall width of the car shall not exceed 2 3/4 inches.
- ⇒ The overall height of the car must not exceed 5 inches.
- ⇒ The car must have 1 3/4" clearance between the wheels.
- ⇒ The car must have 3/8" clearance underneath the body.
- ⇒ The block may be shaped any way that is desired, but the wood provided in the kit must be used.
- ⇒ The wheels supplied by the kit must be used. The wheels may not be cut, drilled, beveled or rounded. You may remove the seam from the wheels.
- ⇒ The axles supplied with the kit must be used. They may be polished or lubricated with dry graphite powder only.
- ⇒ Wheel bearings, washers or bushings are prohibited.
- ⇒ The car must be freewheeling, with no starting devices and must not ride on any type of springs.
- ⇒ No loose material of any kind may be used, such as lead shot, but details such as the steering wheel, driver, decals, painting, and interior detail are permissible as long as these details do not exceed the maximum length, width, and weight specifications.

- No masonite or wood type mount or frames of any type allowed.
- Laser prints are **NOT** allowed.
- Any picture that has been digitally altered in any way, must be entered into the "Digitally Enhanced" photography Category – (For example: Removing red eye, touch ups, removing anything, or brightening.) **NO EXCEPTIONS.**
- Your name and club must be on the back on the top right corner.

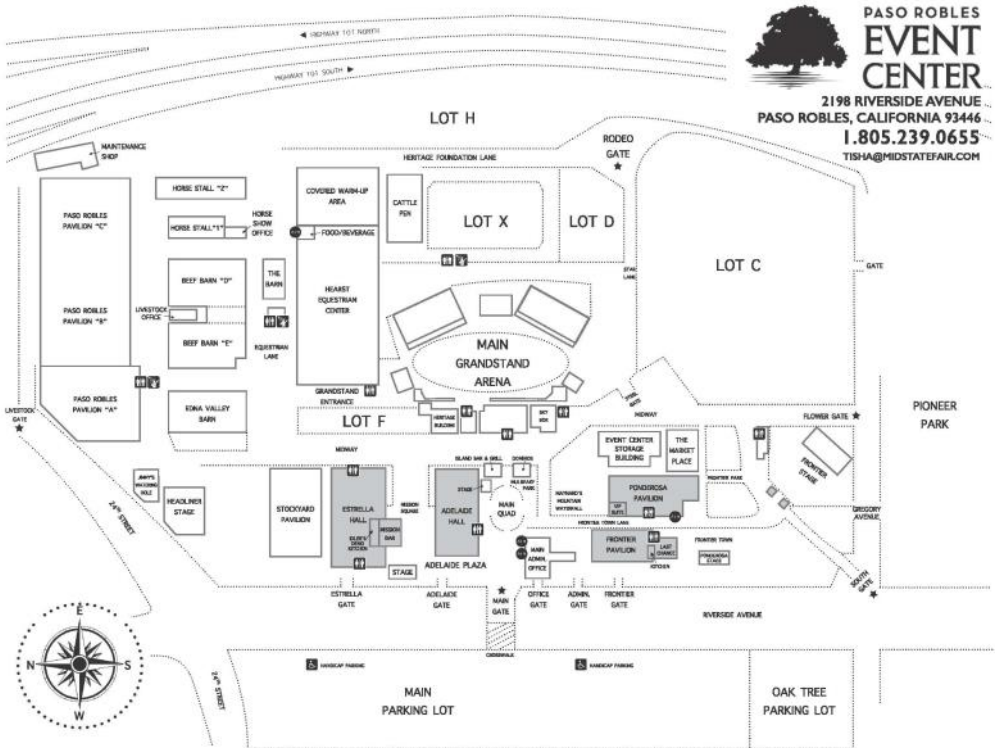
