Get your supplies and plants early, they maybe gone when you need them.



It's winter pruning season. Time to prune stone fruit, except apricots, roses and woody shrubs. When Master Gardeners visited the Haagen-Dazs Bee Haven in Davis the host told us they do heavy pruning on the woody shrubs in winter. She said if you visit in January and February all you would see is woody stubs. Here is a picture of Salvia from the Bee Haven Garden.
