### 4-H Participation Makes a Difference!

Those of us involved in the 4-H YDP have long known that participation in 4-H programs makes a difference in the lives of youth. Now we have evaluation data that supports these long held claims. Data collected in a national longitudinal study of 4-H and non 4-H youth provides strong evidence that when the strengths of youth are aligned with healthy positive youth development practices youth thrive (Learner, 2007, 2008, and 2009).

Here are some of the highlights of the national study:

- Youth who were in 4-H for at least one year by eighth grade were 3.5 times more likely to contribute to their families, themselves and their communities.
- 4-H youth ranked 41% lower in risk/problem behaviors measures than youth who participated in other out-of-school time activities.
- 4-H youth were more behaviorally and emotionally engaged in school.
- Youth who participated in 4-H at least twice per month:
  - Showed greater confidence
  - Reported higher grades
  - Were 1.6 times more likely to plan to go to college
  - Scored higher on civic identity and engagement measures
  - Had a greater ability to express opinions on community issues
  - More likely to help neighbors and bond with adults and teachers

Youth who participate in 4-H are more likely to participate in science, engineering, and technology activities, projects and programs, and:

Report they plan to take science, engineering and tech-

nology courses after high school  
Pursue careers in science, engineering and technology  
Perform higher than their peers in science and engineering subjects.

### **15 Ways to celebrate National 4-H week while promoting 4-H in your community (October 4-10, 2009)**

1. Create a media event by getting a commitment from every 4-H'er for individual service projects during National 4H Week. Print their pledges in the newspaper and encourage the members to supply photos of their work. Better yet, send the newspaper photographer to catch the 4-H'ers at work.
2. Distribute green bottles and bubbles. Invite everyone to have a green bubble-blowing party and 4-H Week reception.
3. Have a National 4-H Week street party under a big 4-H banner
4. Kick off 4-H week with a ***Battle of the Bands***. Invite everyone.
5. Have a community 4-H scavenger hunt. Advertise a list of items (a real four-leaf clover, a 4-H enrollment card, the autograph of a 4-H donor, a snapshot of a 4-H'er, etc.). The first person (s) to bring all the correct items to a designated volunteer receives a savings bond or nice donated prize.
6. Have fortune cookies made, with a 4-H message inside each one. Distribute them in restaurants and in other public places.

7. Put a 4-H message on grocery bags.
8. Fly a 4-H flag on the town square.
9. Radio contest: Use questions based on 4-H history and 4-H today. Callers who give correct answers, win a prize. Use 4-H T Shirts, 4-H pens and pencils, and other promotional trinkets.
10. Have a two-way teen membership marathon. Include a fun-run race and a teen recruitment race. Plan a really special short trip or event for the top 10 recruiters and their new teen members. Let other teen members host the event. And invite every teen who participated in the fun-run.
11. Have a First Annual National 4-H Week Pet Show!
12. Have a milk shake marathon or a taste-of-our-county event.
13. Have a 4-H Carnival.
14. Have a 4-H Chili Cook Off.
15. Host a 4-H Skill-A-Thon at your community park.

If you are using **4hOnline** for the first time, you must use the button "I need to set up a profile" in order to begin your enrollment or re-enrollment.
