

CONSTITUTION

Article I

Name: The name of this group shall be Sierra Valley 4-H Club

Article II

Purpose: The purpose of this unit is to aid in the development of its 4-H members through project work, meetings, demonstrations, judging, community service, and events.

Article III

Officers: The officers of this group shall be president, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Reporter.

BY-LAWS

Article I

Election Of Officers: The officers shall be elected by ballot at the Oct. meeting each year.

Article II

Duties Of Officers: The Secretary shall keep minutes of all 4-H meetings, At the end of each 4-H year the secretary will turn the secretary book into the club advisor.
The Treasurer shall receive and keep all moneys belonging to the group. At the end of each 4-H year the treasurer will turn in the treasurer book to the club advisor, and turn in a summary sheet to the 4-H extension office.

Article III

Meetings: The regular meeting of the group shall take place on the second Wednesday of each month.

Article IIII

4-H members shall not miss more than three (3) un-excused meetings. To be excused you must call the club advisor or your project leader prior to the meeting.

Article V

All members must turn in an up-to-date project book to the project leader when signing up for the fair.

Article VI

A member must have completed at least one (1) year in Sierra Valley 4-H Club to hold an office.

Article VII

4-Her's in their first year can not vote for officers, but can vote on everything else that is brought to a vote after elections.

Article VIII

One parent per family must attend the Sept. and Oct. meetings for enrollment.

Article VIIII

4-Her's that live in another county in the winter (9 years old through the 12th grade) then move to this county, must join a 4-H club in that county and live by that 4-H clubs by-laws. The 4-Her must also join Sierra Valley 4-H.

Article X

4-Her's after their senior year and still meeting age requirements, and Exchange students, will be allowed to join Sierra Valley 4-H club if they have met project requirements for the prior 4-H year in this club.

Article XI

This club is open to all persons without regard to race, creed, religion, color, national origin, sex, mental or physical handicap, age ancestry, sexual orientation, marital status, citizenship, medical condition, nor because individuals are disabled.

Article XII

Amendments: These by-laws may be amended by a majority vote of the 4-H members present at any regular meeting.

The constitution and by laws were adopted Sept. 1988.

Sierra Valley 4-H meets the second Wednesday of each month, 7:30 p.m. at the Sierra Valley, Vinton Grange.

4-H members shall not miss more than three (3) un-excused meetings. To be excused you must call the community leader or your project leader prior to the meeting.

All 4-H'ers must turn in an up-to-date project book to the project leader when signing up for the fair.

A 4-Her must have completed at least 1 year in Sierra Valley 4-H club to hold office.

4-Her's in their first year can not vote for officers, but can vote on every thing else that is brought to a vote after the elections.

One parent per family must attend the September and October meetings for enrollment.

4-Her's that live in another county in the winter (9 years old through the 12th grade) then move to this county, must join a 4-H club in that county and live by that 4-H clubs by-laws. The 4-Her must also join Sierra Valley 4-H club.

4-Her's after their senior year and still meeting age requirements, and Exchange students, will be allowed to join Sierra Valley 4-H club if they have met project requirements for the prior 4-H year in this club.

No by-law can be added or deleted, for a period of two (2) years.
