3. The exhibit should cover what was taught, done and learned in the project, which should include a journal, notebook or poster.
4. Honey should be entered in the Foods & Nutrition Area in the 'Honey' division.
5. You must currently be enrolled in a Beekeeping Project and have attended 80% of your project meetings.
6. Project Leaders or Club Leaders are responsible for making attendance determinations.

CLOTHING & TEXTILES AREA

RULES:

1. Limited to 1 entry per division, per person.
2. Specify under "Description" on entry form what the item is.
3. Imaginology Entries will follow the rules and guidelines set by the Fashion Revue Committee.
4. 'Purchased' Category for State Fashion Revue are not acceptable entries at this event. All entries in this area must either be made by the 4-H member or modified as per the division requirements below.
5. You must currently be enrolled in a Clothing, Sewing or Fashion Revue Project and have attended 80% of your project meetings.
6. Project Leaders or Club Leaders are responsible for making attendance determinations.

COMMUNITY SERVICE AREA

RULES:

1. Limited to 1 entry in this area per person or group.
2. Specify under "Description" on entry form what the item is.
3. Community service is defined as any service performed for the good of the community, an organization, or an individual in need.
4. Entry must consist of the following:
 - a. List the name and age of all members who participated
 - b. List the name and phone number of the organization (or individual) you assisted
 - c. One standard page describing how you became involved in the project, what you did and the impact that it had or is continuing to have
 - d. One standard page of photos reflecting your work. You may choose to use a display board to display your work. It must include the same information as above.
 - e. Please note the role of the adult advisor if done as a group, or the role of each family member if done as a family.

RULES:

1. Limited to 1 entry per division, per person.
2. Specify under "Description" on entry form what the item is.
3. Exhibit must be clear as to its use or include an explanation of what it will be used for.
4. You must currently be enrolled in a Computer or Computer related Project or be your Club's web designer, and have attended 80% of your project meetings.
5. Project Leaders or Club Leaders are responsible for making attendance determinations.

5. You must currently be enrolled in a Cake Decorating Project and have attended 80% of your project meetings.
6. Project Leaders or Club Leaders are responsible for making attendance determinations.

FINE ARTS AREA

RULES:

5. All pictures must be framed and adequately wired for hanging. A mat does not qualify as a frame. No clips.
6. Entry must be adequately and securely labeled on the back. Labels must list: Name, Club, Age of Artist, Medium used and Title of Work. Include a small card (1" x 2") with the Name and Club of the artist to displayed with the art work.
7. No craft of any kind will be accepted in the Fine Arts Area.
8. No wet paintings will be accepted.
9. You must currently be enrolled in a Fine Arts or Performing Arts Project and have attended 80% of your project meetings.
10. Project Leaders or Club Leaders are responsible for making attendance determinations.

5. You must currently be enrolled in a Horticulture or Plant Science related Project or the Home Environment Project, and have attended 80% of your project meetings.
6. Project Leaders or Club Leaders are responsible for making attendance determinations.

FOODS, NUTRITION & PRESERVATION AREA

RULES:

1. Limited to 1 entry per division, per person.
2. Specify under "Description" on entry form what the item is.
3. Enter recipes equivalent with your age level and cooking ability.
4. Commercial mixes are acceptable only for Primary Members unless a mix is only one of many ingredients in the recipe.
5. All entries must be brought on disposable plates only large enough to hold the exhibit. Cover items with clear plastic film or a clear plastic bag.
6. Attached should be a recipe card on a 3" x 5" card covered with plastic film or laminated.
7. Food Products not put on display will be disposed of following judging.
8. No commercial bread machines may be used in making / baking bread entries.
9. No paraffin seals. All canning exhibits must be in sealed jars.
10. You must currently be enrolled in an Cooking, Baking, Food Preservation or similar Project and have attended 80% of your project meetings.
11. Project Leaders or Club Leaders are responsible for making attendance determinations.

Div 140: Baked Products – (No pies or fruit dessert will be accepted due to quick spoilage. Only baked products NOT requiring refrigeration for safety may be exhibited.) (Quantities: Muffins, biscuits, rolls & Cookies – 6 each; Cakes – ½ cake + 1 slice; Breads – ½ loaf + 1 slice)

Div 141: Cooked Products –
(Non-baked items may be melted and / or cooked but not baked, such as candies, cookies, bars, etc) (Quantities: Candies, rolls, etc – 6 each; Large items – ½ of the item + 1 piece)

Div 142: Homemade Food Mixes
— (Submit one jar of your food mix. It will be judged on appearance only. The top of the jar may be decorated. You must submit a recipe with your entry.)

HOME ENVIRONMENT AREA

RULES:

1. Limited to 1 entry per division, per person.
2. Specify under "Description" on entry form what the item is.
3. Home Environment / Home Furnishings are items you have made where you learned and applied principles of design using colors, texture, patterns and shapes to make the home more attractive, convenient and comfortable. Includes non-wearable knitting, crochet and quilting.
4. Include an explanation telling the Judges what the article is, how it was made, and pictures or a sketch on how and where it will be used in the home. The surrounding colors, patterns and shapes are to be included in either the explanation or by using samples.
5. Items can be, but are not limited to: bedspreads, comforters, covered baskets or boxes, dust ruffles, lamp shades, non-wearables, outdoor furniture, picture frames, pillows, placemats, quilts or quilted items, refinished furniture, centerpieces, etc.
6. Exhibit may consist of a single item or a coordinated exhibit consisting of 2-5 items.
7. NO ARTS & CRAFTS ITEMS ARE TO ENTERED IN THIS AREA.
8. You must currently be enrolled in an Arts & Crafts, Foods, Sewing, or similar Project and have attended 80% of your project meetings.
9. Project Leaders or Club Leaders are responsible for making attendance determinations.

HORTICULTURE & PLANT SCIENCE AREA

RULES:

1. Limited to 1 entry per division and 5 total entries in this area per person.
2. Specify under "Description" on entry form what the item is.
3. Exhibits in this area must have been grown by the exhibitor as a part of their 4-H project.
4. Exhibits must be adequately and correctly labeled with species and type or common botanical names and variety.
5. Exhibits must be on a white paper plate only. No baskets or decorations.
6. You must currently be enrolled in a Horticulture or Plant Science related Project and have attended 80% of your project meetings.
7. Project Leaders or Club Leaders are responsible for making attendance determinations.

Div 160: Vegetable - Harvested

Specimens required:

- Large vegetables (pumpkin, squash) – 1
- Tomatoes, beet carrots, sweet potatoes, potatoes, cucumbers, etc – 5
- Broccoli, cabbage, cauliflower, celery, lettuce, etc – 2
- Green onions, dill, parsley, etc – 1 bunch
- Peas, beans & other pod vegetables – 12 pods

- Large fruit (watermelon) – 1

INTERLOCKING BLOCKS AREA

RULES:

1. Limited to 1 entry per division, a total of 2 entries in this area per person.
2. Specify under "Description" on entry form what the item is.
3. Includes Projects such as Legos™, K'NEX™, Tinker Toys™ or similar interlocking building bricks.
4. All parts of model must be glued, mounted or secured on a sturdy base. Base not to exceed 2' x 2'. Any model that comes apart will not be displayed and might not be judged.
5. Schematic or plans required with each entry.
6. If you enter a robot, you may also enter the robot's programming in the Computer Area. However, you must be a member of a Robotics Project to do so.
7. You must currently be enrolled in an Interlocking Blocks Project and have attended 80% of your project meetings.
8. Project Leaders or Club Leaders are responsible for making attendance determinations.

1. Limited to 2 total entries in this area per person.
2. Specify under "Description" on entry form what the item is.
3. This area gives members an opportunity to further their learning and share their knowledge in outdoor life.
4. This project must emphasize a specific learning process and can be shown by an equipment display, poster or notebook.
5. You must currently be enrolled in an Outdoor Adventure related Project and have attended 80% of your project meetings.
6. Project Leaders or Club Leaders are responsible for making attendance determinations.

PHOTOGRAPHY AREA

RULES:

1. Limited to 1 entry per division in this area per person.
2. Specify under "Description" on entry form what the item is, photo title, type of camera used and whether the photo was commercially or self-processed.
3. Original photos or negatives must have been taken within the current 4-H year to be eligible for Youth Expo.
4. All photos must be delivered framed and adequately wired for hanging. No clips or saw tooth hangers. Not to exceed 16" x 20" framed.
5. You must currently be enrolled in a Photography Project and have attended 80% of your project meetings.
6. Project Leaders or Club Leaders are responsible for making attendance determinations.

Div 300: Subject Goup – (3-5 black & white or color prints. Similar subject mounted on single mounting. Minimum print size: 3" x 4". Maximum print size: 5" x 7". All photos must be mounted as a single unit)

Div 301: Sequence Photo Story – (or 'how-to' series) (3-5 black & white or color prints. Minimum print size: 3" x 4". Maximum print size: 5" x 7". All photos must be mounted as a single unit)

Div 302: Feature Photo – (Single photo - black & white 8" x 10" or larger; color 5" x 7" or larger. Maximum print size: 11" x 14".)

Div 303: Photo Album – (Minimum of 20 photographs mounted in a regular photo album on pages not less than 8 ½" x 11".)

Div 304: Pinhole Camera – (Camera must be constructed by exhibitor and entered with photo for judging, and one picture taken with the camera. Photos do not need to be framed, but do need to be artistically mounted.)

Div 305: Close-up Photos, Black & White or Sepia – (3-5 black & white or sepia prints taken at a distance of 24" or less from a subject and mounted on a single board.)

Div 306: Close-up Photos, Color – (3-5 color prints taken at a distance of 24" or less from a subject and mounted on a single board.)

Div 307: Available Light Photos, Black & White or Sepia - (3-5 black & white or sepia prints taken without flash or direct sunlight and mounted on a single board)

Div 308: Available Light Photos, Color - (3-5 color prints taken without flash or direct sunlight and mounted on a single board)

Div 309: Promotional – (Photograph of 4-H members involved in a 4-H activity that could be used in a newspaper or magazine. Print size: 5" x 7" or 8" x 10". All photos must be mounted as a single unit)

SCIENCE, ENGINEERING & TECHNOLOGY

RULES:

1. Limited to 2 entry in this area per person.
2. Specify under "Description" on entry form what the item is.
3. Models, capable of flight, must be entered in the correct division.
 - a. No engines or fuel permitted as part of the entry (engines (without fuel) to be entered in their own division.
 - b. Project leader should certify that the model has flown. (photos are acceptable)
4. Models must be designed, built and painted by the member.
5. You must currently be enrolled in a Rocketry, Science, Robotics or comparable Project and have attended 80% of your project meetings. If Leaders have questions about whether an entry can be entered in these divisions, please contact Alex Martin 714-323-5951.
6. Project Leaders or Club Leaders are responsible for making attendance determinations.

Div 50: Aircraft / Rotorcraft (capable of flight)

TABLE SETTING AREA

RULES:

1. Limited to 1 entry in this area per person.
2. Specify under "Description" on entry form what the item is.
3. Member is responsible for bringing his / her own card table and setting up the display with no help from others.
4. Two place settings must be shown, along with table decorations and Menu card.
5. Be creative and imaginative with the centerpiece rather than using a commercial centerpiece. If fresh flowers are used, they must be watered and kept fresh for the entire weekend.
6. No food items may be used. No wrapped candy.
7. You must currently be enrolled in a Cooking, Baking, Food Preservation, Home Environment or similar Project and have attended 80% of your project meetings.
8. Project Leaders or Club Leaders are responsible for making attendance determinations.

3. Schematics or plans are required with each entry.
4. Projects will be judged on appearance, workmanship, originality, neatness and utility.
5. Kits or kit conversions must be entered in the Kit Division.
6. You must currently be enrolled in a Woodworking related Project and have attended 80% of your project meetings.
7. Project Leaders or Club Leaders are responsible for making attendance determinations.

Div 325: Small Woodworking Project (Small woodworking projects include, but are not limited to: toys, clip boards, wall or mantel clocks, sports equipment, jewelry boxes, trays, puzzles, games, etc.)
