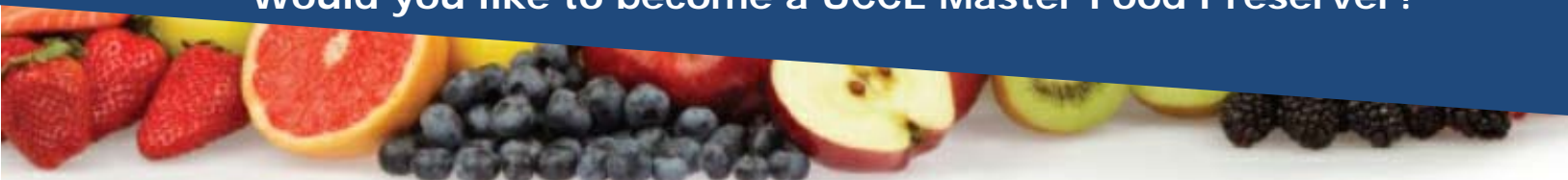

The Master Food Preserver program is a public-service community outreach providing up-to-date information on food safety and preservation. A Master Food Preserver is a volunteer who is formally educated in food preservation/food safety and is certified by a university cooperative extension. Volunteers are qualified to teach food preservation/food safety in addition to disseminating that information via lectures, talks and other county events. Our program is only open to residents of Orange County.

New Certification Classes Begin September 2016

The next Master Food Preservation/Food Safety (MFP) certification class in Orange County is scheduled to begin Tuesday, September 6, 2016. Certification in the program requires completion of a 10 week food preservation/food safety training class with hands-on training, a weekly test, an oral presentation with demonstration and a final written exam. The class will be held on Tuesdays from 10:00 am to 2:00 pm at the South Coast Research & Extension Center in Irvine.
