# 2022 Fashion Revue - Awards Explanation



- Scorecards have 7 sections to evaluate the presentation and the outfit entered
- Entries are evaluated using the Danish system
- Each entry receives recognition based upon individual merit
- The Blue & Red awards are from the final average score by the evaluation team
- Evaluators chose the top entry to be the County Winner and the second place entry is awarded County Medalist
- Primary entries only receive comments and are not scored

# Consumer Science \$40 Purchased - definition



Participants in this category shopped for an entire outfit with the total cost not to exceed \$40.00, including shoes but not sales tax.

Receipts from the current 4-H year were required for any visible item. Gifts, prior purchases, and items without receipts were not eligible.

This category focused on value vs. cost, versatility, the shopping experience, and coordination of the outfit within the cost limit.

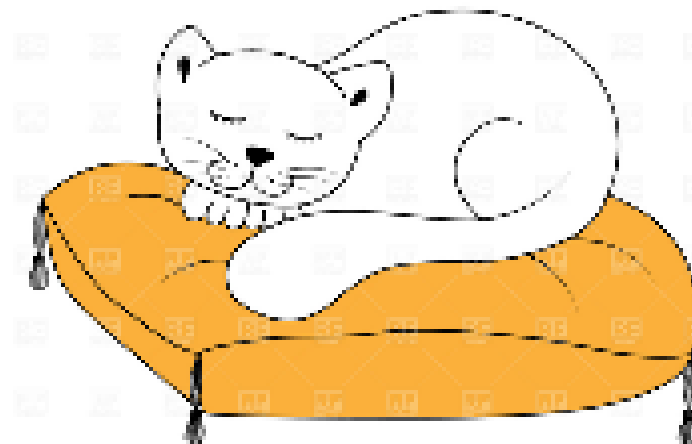


# Make It for Your Animal Category - definition

# Trashion Fashion Category - definition



"Trashion" combines environmentalism with innovation. Trashion helps give new life to waste materials that would not normally be used again.

Participants in this challenge created a garment out of recycled, re-purposed, secondary use materials. The garment must be made from at least 75% recyclable or reused materials that would otherwise be thrown away or recycled.

The entry must include an environmental fact about one of the material's effect on the environment and how the material can be reduced, recycled or reused by the public.

This is a **State** category.
