WHAT IS 4-H? The 4-H Youth Development Program is an informal educational opportunity where youth learn by doing, in project areas like science, health, agriculture, & citizenship. The 4-H Community Club program offers a wide variety of activities for youth, ages 5-19. Join our club, take part in monthly meetings, explore & empower young people with skills to lead for a lifetime.

WHAT IS REEDLEY 4-H? *Reedley 4-H serves communities of Reedley, Orange Cove, Squaw Valley, Dunlap, Miramonte and the surrounding farm and foothill areas.*

We have one general club meeting each month from September through June (skipping October due to Fresno Fair activities). **Our meetings are generally the first Monday of each month, meetings usually start at 6:00PM and are held at Riverview School in Reedley, CA.** Project meeting frequency and locations vary depending on the specific project. **The projects we will offer this year are:**

WHO CAN JOIN 4-H? Youth who are at least 9 years old by December 31st of the current school year and no older than 19 may join as Regular 4-H members.

Adults age 18 and over may serve as 4-H Volunteers.

Youth who are at least 5 years old on December 31st of the current school year may join as a Primary 4-H member. They can participate in many activities, although they may **NOT** participate in animal projects.

All fees (\$45.00 for a youth member and no charge for adult volunteers) must be submitted at the next club meeting. Our Ag Boosters strongly support our members and offer to pay a portion (\$27.00 per member and \$30 per leader) of the fees. Monthly payments may be an option for families with multiple members.
