What is a Judging Contest?

A judging class consists of four items. The 4-H'er is asked to evaluate and rank the class in order from best to worst. Points are given on how close the participant comes to matching the placing an expert gives the class. Junior, Intermediate and Senior 4-H participants will also be given the opportunity to give oral reasons. Oral reasons enable the participant to explain to a judge why they placed the class the way they did. Points are given for how convincing the reasons are. Even if the class wasn't placed correctly, if good reasons are given, the points will reflect that.

Get a head start on preparing a *presentation* for Fresno County's Presentation Day by beginning now! 4-H encourages every member to develop and polish their public speaking skills by participating in County Presentation Day. There are many ways to participate in Presentation Day. Participants may give a traditional demonstration or illustrated talk where they show "how-to-do" something using visual aids or posters or a prepared speech or an interpretive reading or an impromptu speech etc. The ways to participate are explained in the CA 4-H Presentation Day Manual. Take time to read about the various ways to participate in Presentation Day, and then research your topic. Find an interpretive reading you enjoy or a favorite recipe you can use to develop into a presentation. Prepare your script, make your posters, or gather your props, if your category requires such items. Spend time practicing your presentation. Save the Date of Saturday, April 18, 2026 - Livestock Achievement Day

Our Livestock Achievement Committee is hard at work planning a full day of activities for Livestock Achievement Day, scheduled for Saturday, April 18, 2026. Members will have an opportunity to “show what they know” about their species of livestock, take part in a fitting clinic, and do in-person YQCA training. The day is still in the planning phase but be sure to mark the date on your calendar **and start preparing for Livestock Achievement Day 2026!** Identify the body parts of your animal, different feedstuffs, common breeds, and types of equipment used for your livestock. Talk the talk by learning the correct terminology, knowing how to evaluate livestock, and knowing basic veterinary care. Further your knowledge by learning wholesale and retail cuts for market animal projects and milk handling for dairy goat projects. **Be sure to check out the many resources** that are available to help educate leaders and members about their species of livestock. 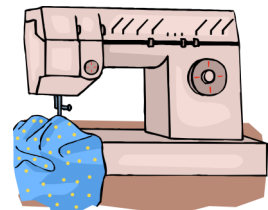

Category 1 - Dairy Foods - One of the principal ingredients must be a dairy product such as butter, milk, cheese, sour cream, yogurt, etc. No substitutes. No meat. Acceptable entries include: Appetizers/ cheese balls, cookies, cakes, desserts, etc.

Category 2 - Traditional - Must include story/bio about the origin and/or tradition of the recipe and how it relates to your family. No meat. Acceptable entries include: breads, cookies, cakes, desserts.

Category 3 - Candies - Caramels/taffies, chew candies, creams, fudges, divinity dipped candies, fruit and nut candies or brittles, candied apples, hard candies, lollipops, etc.

Category 4 - Healthier Goodies! Main ingredient(s) must be nutritious i.e., whole wheat grains, bran, nuts, fruit, vegetables. No meat. Acceptable entries include: Appetizers, snacks, granola etc.

Category 5 - Trix-From-a-Mix - Entry must include ADDITIONAL ingredients SEPARATE from the box mix instructions. Acceptable entries include: Appetizers & snacks (no meat items), cookies, breads, desserts, cakes. *Additional Ingredient must be specified on recipe - such as lemon cake mix with 7-up added.

Category 6 - Holiday Decorations - Must be designed and assembled by the 4-H'er. Entries may include: Centerpieces, Place Settings (include menu, no food) suggest photo before quick assembly), Gift Basket (filled & decorated), Creative Holiday Craft (hand crafted holiday decorations, ornaments, jewelry, etc.).

Category 7 - For 2026 - Food Photography (this category changes every year). Photos should be 8x10. Entries must be mounted on mat or foam core board. No frames. Photos must be taken by member during the 2024-25 or 2025-26 4-H years. Food photographed does not need to be made by member.

Category 8 - Chili Cook Off - Sponsored by the Fresno-Kings County Cattle Womens' Association - Must include beef as an ingredient, and be served in a crock pot. (Electricity will be available). *Special prizes* Must be maintained at a temperature of no less than 140°F.

*Instructor Training Workshops are for those interested in becoming certified for the specific discipline. Upon successful completion of the workshop, 4-H Adult Volunteers will be certified as an Instructor, which allows them to lead a project in that specific discipline. Teen Leaders (high school age 4-H members) are eligible to participate provided there is an adult leader in their home county they will be assisting. Upon successful completion of the workshop, Teen Leaders will be certified as a an Instructor with a Teen Leader designation. Teen Leaders are not eligible to lead shooting sports projects or activities on their own, however, once they become an adult their instructor designation will be transferred with them.

*Additionally, *recertification is required every five years*, which can be fulfilled by successfully completing another workshop in that discipline or earning continuing education credits through participation in annual shooting sports instructor meetings
